

**NOTE A.**—The light dotted perpendicular lines, which divide the spaces intended for numbers on this Schedule, are intended to separate the units, tens, &c., from each other, and the Enumerator should be careful that the figures are written within the small spaces so formed, thus:

**NOTE B.**—Make an affirmative entry by a slanting line (thus /) in one of the three columns, 2, 3, and 4, according as the fact is in the case of each farm—in column 2, if the occupier is the owner of the farm; in column 3, if he is the tenant at a fixed money rental; in column 4, if he conducts it for a share of the product.

**NOTE C.**—Enumerators will observe that there are 100 questions relating to each family.
