Notes:

Breeding Codes

OBSERVED COLUMN (O):
O - Species observed within safe dates but not in suitable habitat (and no evidence of breeding).

POSSIBLE BREEDING COLUMN (PO):
X - Species observed within safe dates in suitable nesting habitat, with no other indication of breeding noted.

PROBABLE BREEDING COLUMN (PR):
P - Pair observed in suitable habitat within safe dates.
S - Singing male present (or breeding calls heard) on more than one date at least 2 days, a week or more apart, at the same place. Second date must be within safe dates.
T - Permanent territory presumed through defense of territory (chasing individuals of same species).
D - Courtship or display between a male and a female or 2 males, including courtship feeding or copulation.
N - Bird visiting possible nest site.
A - Agitated behavior or anxiety calls of an adult that suggest probable presence of a nearby nest or young
B - Nest-building or excavation of nest hole by wrens or woodpeckers. Wrens may build many fake nests, and woodpeckers drill roosting holes

CONFIRMED BREEDING COLUMN (CO):
CN - Carrying nest material.
NB - Nest building by any species except wrens and woodpeckers.
PE - Physiological evidence of breeding on bird in hand.
DD - Distraction display or injury feigning.
UN - Used nest found (occupied or laid within the period of the study).
PY - Precocial young. Flightless young of precocial species.
FL - Recently fledged young incapable of sustained flight.
ON - Occupied nest. Adults leaving or entering nest site in circumstances indicating occupied nest.
CF - Adult carrying food for young. Take care to avoid confusion with courtship feeding (D).
FY - Adult carrying food for recently fledged young.
FS - Adult carrying fecal sac.
NE - Nest containing eggs, bird sitting on eggs, or egg shells found below nest.
NY - Nest with young seen or heard, or downy young of waterfowl, quail, waders, etc.
