Mathematical Sciences: One math course number 17 or higher, or Statistics 51 or higher, or Computer Science 008 or higher, or Philosophy 13, or Anthropology 113/Linguistics 163, or Linguistics 075 Social Sciences: Two 3-credit courses in social science disciplines
