**Notes:**

This is merely one suggested route to completing a degree in Latin American and Caribbean Studies.

The path followed by students will depend on their how soon they enter the major, their desired pace, entry level of Spanish language, other academic plans, study-abroad travel, etc. The exact courses taken will depend on individual interests in consultation with an academic advisor in the department.

SPAN 145 - Intro Lit & Culture Latin America I (also may count as literature distribution)

SPAN 146 - Intro Lit & Culture Latin America II (also may count as literature distribution)

**Major = 30 credits including:**

3 courses selected from the following 5 courses (each course will count toward the D2 Non-European Cultures Diversity requirement and a distribution):

*MU 014 - D2: Music of Latin America & Caribbean (also may count toward a fine arts distribution)*

*ANTH 161 - D2: Cultures of South America (also may count toward a social science distribution)*

*HST 062 - D2: Colonial Latin American History (also may count toward a humanities distribution)*

*HST 063 - D2: Modern Latin American History (also may count toward a humanities distribution)*

*POLS 174 - D2: Latin American Politics (also may count toward a social science distribution)*

Additional 15 credits from related courses (see LACS Schedule of Courses) chosen in consultation with an advisor.

**Minor Requirement:**

A minor is required if you are pursuing a B.A. degree through the College of Arts and Sciences with only one major.

Students pursuing a double major need not complete a minor.

**Distribution Requirements: B.A. degrees in the College of Arts and Sciences require completion of 7 distribution categories:**

*Fine Arts: one 3-credit course in a fine arts discipline*

*Foreign Language: two 3-credit courses in the same foreign language*

*Humanities: two 3-credit courses in a humanities discipline*

*Natural Sciences: two courses from specific departments; one course must include a lab*

*Literature: One 3-credit course in literature*

*Mathematical Sciences: One math course number 17 or higher, or Statistics 51 or higher, or Computer Science 008 or higher, or Philosophy 13, or Anthropology 113/Linguistics 163, or Linguistics 075*

*Social Sciences: Two 3-credit courses in social science disciplines*

**General Requirements:**

*One Diversity Category 1 course – minimum 3 credits*

*One Diversity Category 2 course from list of D2 Non-European Cultures courses – minimum 3 credits*

*One Quantitative Reasoning course–minimum 3 credits*

*One Sustainability Category course - minimum 3 credits*

*One Writing and Information Literacy course– minimum 3 credits*

>>A TAP course will satisfy UVM's Writing and Information Literacy requirement and might also count toward a distribution.

>>>Sustainability courses and Diversity courses might also count toward a distribution.
