Living/Learning Center Mission Statement

The Living/Learning Center, which opened in 1973, is an academic resource whose mission is to create an environment for students to integrate their academic/artistic studies and their residential experiences, and to provide a venue for faculty and students to interact outside of the classroom. The Center encourages faculty, staff, and student programs that foster innovative and interdisciplinary learning experiences that bring the intellectual life of the University in close alliance with the students' lives outside the classroom. The Center provides a unique environment for faculty, staff, and students in each of the University schools and colleges to offer particular curricular elements in an atmosphere that fosters broad opportunities for intellectual discourse.

To Achieve our Mission, Living/Learning:

- **Supports innovative, residentially-based educational programs.** The focus of the Living/Learning Center are the 40 academic programs, each of which is a year-long plan of course work, independent study, seminars, field trips and other special activities which support a specific program theme. A selection of recent programs includes: Africa House, Exploring Culture through Tea, Clay: Pottery, Sculpture and..., Community Connections, and Caribbean House. Programs are designed and directed by students, staff or faculty members and reflect the educational interests of the program leaders and participants.
- **Connects students with faculty and staff.** The physical design of the Living/Learning Center facilitates educational and social interactions between all members of the university community. The year-long courses of study include activities that bring students and faculty together outside of the classroom.
- **Provides students with an opportunity to take responsibility for part of their education.** Student-designed programs provide the opportunity for students to design a year-long set of activities in an area of interest, for example, Theater, Film Studies or Outdoor Education. Student program directors are provided with leadership training to help them make the most of their experience. Students may also sign up for a one-credit Leadership Seminar taught by Center staff as part of their program director experience.
- **Exposes students to the performing and creative arts.** Through the efforts and expertise of accomplished staff artists, the Center offers pottery and photography studios that provide the Living/Learning community, as well as all members of the University and Burlington communities, with the opportunity for informal instruction, access to the facilities and equipment, and the opportunity for public display in the Center's gallery/exhibit space.
- **Provides a facility that supports students' educational, social and recreational needs.** In addition to faculty and administrative offices, classrooms and faculty apartments, the Center also has a reading room/reference library (the George D. Aiken Reading Room), as well as a computer lab, art gallery, full-functioning mailroom, two dining options (Alice's Café and The University Marché), and central commons area.

ACCESS OFFICE

The ACCESS Office, located in room A170, works closely with students with all types of documented disabilities, securing solutions to assist with access issues encountered in courses, programs or activities. Students receive assistance with academic accommodations, information and referral, and other support services. AIKEN READING ROOM

The George D. Aiken Reading Room is named after a former Vermont Governor, U.S. Senator and friend who spent many hours with Center students in the early years of the Center's existence. The Reading Room offers students a quiet place to study and is open from 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. (Monday-Friday), noon -10:00 p.m. (Saturday and Sunday). 306 Commons.

ATM

AUDIO-VISUAL SERVICES

All of the classrooms in Living/Learning are equipped with audio-visual technology. View available classroom equipment at <http://resource25.uvm.edu>.

Additional audio-visual equipment and media programs (tapes, etc.) are available at the Bailey/Howe Library Media Resources Department. Living/Learning Center programs are encouraged to use A/V equipment for program-related educational purposes. Available equipment at the library includes overhead projectors, 16mm projectors, 35mm slide projectors, movie screens, and video cassette recorders. Advance reservations required. Phone: 656-1944.

BUILDING MAINTENANCE

Students are responsible for cleaning and maintaining their own suites, rooms, and bathroom facilities. We recommend establishing a weekly rotating cleaning duty schedule so that everyone in your suite helps keep things neat! Each suite will be equipped with a mop, pail, and plunger. Each bathroom in the suite will contain a toilet swab, sponge, and all-purpose cleaner (that can be replenished). A "how to" sheet will also be posted on each bathroom door. The Center's Building Services staff is responsible for maintaining all common and public areas of the Center. Please help them keep these areas presentable.

CATCARD ACCESS

Residents of the Living/Learning Center will use their CatCard (UVM ID card) instead of a key to gain access to these buildings after hours.

CLASSROOMS

Classrooms are located throughout the Commons Building and on the ground floor of A-, B- and D-Buildings. Most of the classrooms can be reserved by going online to resource25.uvm.edu. You will need a “chartstring” (budget number) in order to make room requests. If you’d like to reserve a space on campus for a Living/Learning Center program-related event, please come to the L/L Director’s Office, 205 Commons, near the Main Desk. Confirmation of room reservations are sent via e-mail. Classrooms should be returned to their original state after use. Please plan well advance when you will need to reserve a room.

COMMON LOUNGES

On the ground floor in each building are two common lounges that can be used for lounging and socializing. (Rooms A-140, A-180, B-110, B-180, C-140, C-170, D-110, D-140, E-110 and E-160.) These rooms also have laundry and kitchen facilities available for student and program use. All lounges in A and B buildings contain a stove/range. One lounge in C, D and E buildings has a stove/range available for cooking purposes. The following lounges have stoves/ranges: C-170, D-140, E-110.

If you wish to reserve a common lounge for a meeting or social event, please contact the L/L Director’s Office, 205 Commons, 656-4200.

COMPUTER ACCESS

- Mainframe academic computer accounts can be accessed from the L/L Computer Lab on Level 3 of the Commons Building in Room 314. Students with personal computers can access the Campus Network through the network and telephone jacks in their rooms. Contact Student Network Services (656-3808) for more information.

- Many areas of the Living/Learning Center have access to “**Cat’s PAWS,**” the campus-wide wireless computing network. Areas that have wireless network access include each of the lounge/laundry rooms in A, B, C, D and E Buildings. Most public areas in the Commons Building have also been equipped with wireless access points, including the Marché, the Fireplace Lounge, and the third floor of Commons, including the Aiken Reading Room. COMPUTER LAB

- The L/L Computer Lab, located in 314 Commons, offers Dell computers, as well as a laser printer. There is a fee of 10 cents per page for laser printer output (**payable by CatScratch only**). We offer a large selection of software, including the Microsoft Office Suite.
- All computers in the lab are connected to the Campus Network, enabling access to e-mail, the Library’s on-line card catalog, and all academic mainframes. Work/study lab consultants staff the lab. The lab is typically open from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 p.m. (Sunday-Friday), noon-6:30 p.m. (Saturday). Check the lab door for a more detailed schedule.

COOKING APPLIANCES

Students who wish to cook in the residence halls are required to use the designated kitchen facilities provided on the ground floor in the common lounges of each building. Students may not use cooking appliances or grills (including “George Foreman” electric grills) in their rooms, suites, balconies, common spaces, or in the vicinity of the residence halls. Exceptions are coffee pots with automatic shut-offs, 4.0 cubic foot refrigerators that are no more than 34” in height, 700 watt or lower microwaves, all of which are ULA listed.

***Please Note:** Students with unapproved appliances will be asked to pack the equipment and remove it from the building and may face possible judicial action.*

DIRECTOR'S OFFICE

FIREPLACE LOUNGE

The Fireplace Lounge - located in the heart of the Center in the Commons Building - serves as a place for students and programs to meet, study, read mail, attend Gallery openings, or just relax. Most of the Center's social and cultural events are held here, including the weekly Rhythm & Brews Coffeehouses.

GALLERY

The Gallery, located just off the Fireplace Lounge in Commons, is an exhibit space for local artists and students wishing to display their work. The Gallery hosts shows from artists inside and outside the University in shows three or four weeks' in duration. Each new show begins or ends with a reception, to which all are invited. GOVERNANCE

There are a wide variety of opportunities for involvement on Living/Learning Center governance committees. Options range from representatives for each building or program to the Living/Learning Community Action Board, which is responsible for Center-wide programming activities, to involvement in the campus-wide Inter-Residence Association (IRA). Contact your Resident Advisor, the Residence Director or the Assistant Residence Director for additional information about how you can get involved.

INTEGRATED PROFESSIONAL STUDIES

Integrated Professional Studies, part of the College of Education & Social Services, is located in C-150. The department offers academic majors in Early Childhood PreK-3 Teacher Education, Human Development and Family Studies, Family and Consumer Science Teacher Education, and Early Childhood Special Education. All faculty for these programs have

their offices here in the Center. In addition, the Department also operates the UVM Campus Children's Center in C-Building. The Center provides early education and care for forty children ranging in age from six weeks to five years, serves as the student teaching site for PreK-3 majors and also pursues a program of scholarship and professional service related to early childhood education. Work-study positions are often available at the Center and the Department. If you are interested in work-study or in learning more about the majors in this department, please call 656-4050 or stop by the C-150 office.

KEYS

- Each student receives one key at check-in. This key is for entry into your suite and your room only. Please keep this key with you at all times.
- If you lose your key or get locked out of your room, please report to the Main Desk to obtain a temporary loaner key. If this occurs between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m. (when the Main Desk is closed), you can contact the RA on duty who will meet you at the Main Desk to provide you a loaner key.
- Temporary loaner keys issued by the Main Desk are loaned out for a maximum of 24 hours. A maximum of three accidental lock-outs are permitted before a mandatory lock change is ordered for your room or an administrative fine of \$25 is incurred.
- UVM Police Services provides registered key rings and a lost key return service. Feel free to contact them for details about this service.

LAUNDRY

Washers and dryers are located in the lounges on the ground floor of each residential building. Students must provide their own detergent. All washers and dryers are free and must be activated by a UVM ID.

LEARNING COOPERATIVE

- The Learning Cooperative, a part of Academic Support Programs, is a group of faculty, staff, peer tutors, and leaders who work with students through four programs: Subject-Area Tutoring, Learning Skills, Supplemental Instruction, and The Writing Center. We also provide program development support to faculty pursuing new ways to improve learning.
- Through the federal TRIO/Student Support Services, we offer additional academic support. This support is offered to students with limited resources, those who are first generation college students, or those with physical or learning disabilities.
- The Learning Co-op is located in 244 Commons, just off the Fireplace Lounge.
- Hours: 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Monday - Thursday; 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Friday; 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Sunday. Phone: 656-4075.

MAIL

The Mailroom is located on the second floor of the Commons building, near the Fireplace Lounge. Mail is sorted into student boxes daily, Monday through Saturday. The Service Window near the ATM is also open Monday - Saturday for pickup of incoming packages and the sale of postage stamps. **For your protection, a valid ID and a package notice slip are required to obtain your packages at the window.** The U.S. Postal Service picks up outgoing mail at 2:00 p.m. Monday thru Friday, except holidays. University Mail Services picks up outgoing CAMPUS mail each morning, Monday thru Friday. (Note: *Mail sent between buildings on campus does not require postage.*) Service Window hours vary and will be posted.

MUSIC PRACTICE/REHEARSAL ROOM

The 316 Commons music practice/rehearsal room is available to L/L students between 9:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. daily (11:30 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. on weekends). Room 316 Commons contains a Baldwin grand piano. No food, drink or smoking in the practice rooms, please! Guidelines for use of percussion/amplified instruments are posted. The Rehearsal Room is only available to L/L residents, and a key must be signed out at the Main Desk to gain access to the room.

OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION

The Office of International Education, located in B161, provides advice and counsel to UVM students interested in studying, working and/or volunteering abroad. It also assists international students on matters of immigration as well as academic, health and personal issues. Phone: 656-4296.

PHOTOGRAPHY COOPERATIVE

The Photo Co-op, directed by **Ann Barlow**, is a complete facility whose financial and operational responsibilities are shared by all of its members. There are four fully-equipped darkrooms. POTTERY STUDIO

The Pottery Studio, directed by **Joan Watson**, presents an opportunity to work with clay in an informal atmosphere. It is open to all UVM students, faculty and staff, as well as to Burlington area residents. Members have the option of taking classes, working on individual projects, or both.

Equipment includes gas-fired, electric and Raku kilns, five electric wheels, three kick wheels, and a complete stock of glaze chemicals. Co-op memberships are available at \$80.00 per semester for students. Information: 656-4150.

RESIDENCE DIRECTOR/

ASSISTANT RESIDENCE DIRECTOR

The Residence Director is a full-time staff member of the Department of Residential Life, responsible for creating a safe and secure environment in the Living/Learning Center. **T.J. Jourian** coordinates educational and social programming for students, advises the L/L Community Action Board, counsels and advises students, and serves as a resource to the greater University community. He supervises the room change process as well as damage and facility maintenance. T.J. also articulates policies and procedures.

The Residence Director supervises the Assistant Residence Director and Resident Advisors. His office is in the Director's Office, 656-7942. (You can leave a message for T.J. at the Main Desk.)

Nicole Beaudoin is the Assistant Residence Director. She is a graduate student hall supervisor who shares responsibilities with the Residence Director for supervising RAs, coordinating residence education, counseling and advising students, damage and facility maintenance, and articulating policies. Nicole is a great campus resource. You can find her in Commons 229.

RHYTHM & BREWS COFFEEHOUSE

Rhythm & Brews Coffeehouse takes place every Thursday from 9:00 – 11:00 PM in the L/L Fireplace Lounge and features live entertainment, a relaxing and friendly atmosphere, as well as free coffee, tea, and cocoa. (To conserve resources and reduce waste, please bring your own mug.) Musicians from around the region perform biweekly and about two shows a month are reserved for Open Mic Nights. To reserve a performance spot at an Open Mic Night, contact Monique Wright at Monique.Wright@uvm.edu or 656-4200. Some walk-ins are usually available, but not guaranteed. SECURITY

All exterior doors of the Living/Learning Center (with the exception of those in the Commons Building) are locked between 7:00 p.m. – 7:00 a.m. Monday-Friday, and remain locked throughout the weekend. Commons is locked at 10:00 p.m. daily. Be sure to take your CatCard with you if you are going to be out late, so that you may access the building upon your return. Never prop open exterior doors. **Room doors and suite doors should be locked at all times when room/suite occupants are not present, even if you are leaving for "just a few minutes."** It is a good idea to engrave your valuables and record them with UVM Police Services. Drop by the Main Desk to borrow the Center's engraver. Report any suspicious activity to UVM Police Services immediately, 656-3473.

STAFF (RA/PD) OFFICE

The Staff Office located in 236 Commons near the mailboxes, serves as a central office for Resident Advisors (RAs) and Program Directors (PDs) in Living/Learning. RA's are "on duty" each evening. Any questions, problems or emergencies can be handled by the RA on duty. You may contact the RA on duty by calling his/her cell phone: 9-316-7533.

STUDY SPOTS

There are plenty of spaces for you to sneak away for some quiet study time. When not in use, the Center's classrooms in A, B, D and Commons Building make great spots for individual or group study. Common Lounges in each building and in the Fireplace Lounge in Commons are popular study spots. The Aiken Reading Room, located in Room 306 on the third floor of Commons, is designed for quiet study only and is open daily. Room 305 Commons is designated as a group study space.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS

- Each student room is equipped with telephone, network and cable television service. Students are expected to provide their own telephones. Telephones are plugged into the blue jack. Network cables are plugged into the yellow or green jacks. Cable TV is accessed via the round silver connection.
- Each on-campus student has a personal voice mail message box. Please refer to the information in your room for details on accessing your voice mail box or for leaving a message in another student's box. For more information about voice mail and/or telephone service, contact UVM Telecommunications at 656-3472.
- To reach another extension on campus, dial only the last five digits of the extension you are calling (ex. x65555). To dial off-campus within the local area, dial "9", then the full seven digits of the number you are calling. To access long distance services, you must obtain a long-distance access code from Telecommunications (x63472).

TELEVISION / CABLE TV

Cable television service is provided in all student rooms and in the living room area of all suites. Cable TV charges are included as part of your room rent.

UNIVERSITY MARCHÉ

The University Marché opened for business in February 2002, and offers students, faculty and staff a unique dining and market experience. Several dining formats are offered, including:

- Euro: An open concept, European kitchen, featuring a full complement of prepared salads, traditional comfort foods,
- contemporary entrees and vegetarian dishes.
- Gifts from the Garden: A dedicated Vegan platform, featuring lunch and dinner entrees and a vegan/vegetarian retail grocery area.
- Copper Hearth Pizza: Fresh, oven baked pizzas, Italian specials and snacks, Open face Loafer Sandwiches, Soups and a selection of deep-fried favorites like Chicken Tenders and Seasoned French Fries.
- Harvest Hill Bakery: Marché's in-house bake shop. Fresh baked breakfast pastries, daily, as well as a large selection of cookies, cakes, breads and specialty sweets.
