Scholarship Application for the 2025 Extension Master Gardener Course

About the Scholarship:

Recipients will receive a \$250 scholarship from the Northwest Chapter to be applied to the 2025 UVM Extension Master Gardener course. Scholarship funds are raised by Chapter members. In the event a recipient is unable to fulfill requirements for EMG certification, the recipient is expected to, in good faith, reimburse the Chapter for the full cost of the scholarship.

NOTE: Recipients who have fully paid for the course prior to receiving a scholarship will be reimbursed \$250 from the Northwest Chapter.

Eligibility:

- Applicants must live in Addison, Chittenden, Franklin, or Grand Isle County.
- Enroll in the course as a Track 1 (Volunteer Certification Track)* student,
- Pursue a 40-hour internship with UVM EMG-sponsored projects, within a two-year period, and
- Participate in their local Chapter of Extension Master Gardeners (EMG), including Chapter sponsored events and fundraising activities.

Application Deadline:

The completed application <u>and</u> the signed Memorandum of Understanding, must be emailed to Karen Patno at <u>karen.patno@gmail.com</u> by no later than **5:00 pm E.T. on Friday, December 13, 2024**. Applications received after this deadline will <u>not</u> be considered. All applicants will be notified of the results by January 7, 2025.

About the Course:

The University of Vermont Extension Master Gardener program will offer its signature course during winter/spring 2025. Registration is open until the deadline of January 17, 2025. This is a 16-week, non-credit online course that covers the fundamentals of home gardening and is focused on evidence-based plant and soil sciences. Topics include botany basics, soil management, annuals and perennials, insect and disease pest management, fruit and vegetable production and planning, garden pollinator habitat, tree care, and sustainable landscape design.

For 2025, the Extension Master Gardener course will start on January 23, 2025. Track 1 (volunteer certification) students must attend live Zoom sessions each Wednesday evening from 6 to 7:30 p.m. starting on January 29 and running through May 14. The online course content closes to all students on May 29.

- A commitment to be an active volunteer on Chapter projects and events.
