- **21 Proxies** did not have any shareholder proposals. No votes submitted for proxies without shareholder proposals.
- **67 Proxies** had shareholder proposals that were not relevant to the socially responsible investing (SRI) adopted policies. The vote on these proposals is ABSTAIN. 10 of the shareholder proposals in this category called for a report or action regarding the racial equity and/or gender pay gap. 8 called for a report or action regarding transitioning the business to a public benefit corporation.
- **7 Proxies** had shareholder proposals that were voted on by Marie Tieman, Endowment Accountant and related to the SRI policies. These are detailed below:

Resolution Regarding Proxy Voting in Favor of Climate Change Action – Passed in 2008 Charter Communications – April 27, 2021

Issue an annual report disclosure of greenhouse gas emissions. – YES

DuPont de Nemours, Inc. - April 28, 2021

Issue an annual report on plastic pollution. Disclose trends in the amount of plastic released to the environment. – YES

Berkshire Hathaway, Inc. – May 1, 2021

Publish an annual assessment addressing how the company manages physical and transitional climate related risks and opportunities — YES

United Parcel Service – May 13, 2021

Issue a report on reducing UPS's total contribution to climate change. – YES

Walmart Inc. - June 2, 2021

Issue a report describing if and how the company plans to limit its impact on climate change by increasing the scale, pace, and rigor of its plans to reduce refrigerants released from its operations. – YES

Booking Holdings - June 3, 2021

Issue a climate transitions report. Company to provide shareholders with opportunity in the annual proxy statement to provide an advisory vote regarding the publicly available climate policies and strategies. – YES

By-law amendment for an annual vote and report on climate change. – YES
