When the hazard is still present the use of certain PPE may be required for one or more steps but not all of the steps. However, it may be prudent to don all required PPE for the duration of the JHA.

2	Cleaning: Don all PPE Wash the material toward drains or to a collection point for containerizing and disposal at centennial field If washing to a collection point, use a shovel to gather the bulk material first and then wash down the area	Splashing Getting material in eyes/mouth slips/falls	use precautions when washing down. If on a roof, follow all roof rules and guidelins under the UVM Fall Protection Program If you are in a parking area or a spot with pedestrian/vehicle traffic, caution tape off your work area to keep people out. Use high visibility vest or similar clothing Use of eye protection only with 1/2 face respirator. Face shield should also be used with this combination	Coveralls, Kleenguard (breathable); Face shield, plastic; Safety glasses, UVM Issued; Respirator cartridges, P100; Respirator, full-face; Boot, rubber
