The OCME Internship is a highly competitive position, as there are many applicants for only two placements per year. The Undergraduate Research Office Program has developed this application process as a way to present possible candidates to the Medical Examiner, with the hope of providing UVM students access to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner.

The application consists of the cover sheet (below), essay, letter of support (from a faculty member), and unofficial transcript. Please complete the application and submit it to the Undergraduate Research Office, University Heights-North 031C, by Wednesday, November 4th at 4:30 pm. A committee will convene to review the applications and decide which will be sent to the medical examiners office for consideration.

Please note this application covers two separate time periods for internships: Spring 2010 and Summer 2009. The internships are open to all science majors, and can be used for credit (1-3 research credits) or experience. Upon acceptance into the internship program the student can register for an undergraduate research or internship course. No stipend will be provided.

Application Guidelines
(not in order of priority)

1. Students must be in good academic standing.
2. Academic record will weigh heavily in the selection process.
3. Students must be a junior or senior during the 2009-2010 academic year.
4. Prerequisites are: CHEM 141 (Organic Chemistry) and PHYS 31 (Introductory Physics) or PHYS 11 and 12 (Elementary Physics). Co-requisites or substitutions of other University of Vermont courses will not be considered. Transfer credit for equivalent courses will be considered.
