Rubenstein (b) conducted a survey of all it graduates in 2006 and the major findings are summarized below:

A large majority are employed in positions that directly or indirectly tap their specific training in environment and natural resources.

- Private sector businesses top the list of employer type—50%
- □The next largest group of alumni (27.5%) work for government agencies, bureaus or departments.
- Nine percent are employed at the federal level, 11.8% at state, and 6.8% in regional or municipal positions.
- Sixteen percent of Rubenstein School alumni are working for educational institutions. Many are teaching at various levels, or working at universities as researchers.
- Almost eight percent are self-employed (included as a part of private businesses), as forestry consultants, farmers, and a variety of other businesses.
