Who We Serve

The I-Team provides service to students eligible for Special Education in the categories of multiple disabilities, deafblindness, autism spectrum disorders, and/or learning impairments who also meet the following criteria:

- Learn at a significantly slower rate than their peers
- Do not readily maintain learned skills
- Experience difficulty generalizing skills
- Are often nonverbal
- Are challenged in learning both academic and daily living skills.
