



## Nuclear Medicine Technology Program

### Dress Code

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The purpose of the dress code is to instill in the student a sense of pride, confidence and professionalism which will contribute to the confidence of the patient and other health care workers who interact with the student.

Below are some guidelines which are derived on the general principle that the appearance of a Nuclear Medicine Technologist must be neat, clean, professional looking, and appropriate to the work circumstance.

#### BOTH MEN & WOMEN

- Three-quarter length lab coat (required)
- Film and ring badges (required)
- FAHC ID badge

#### MEN

- shirts: tie (optional) with a collared shirt (wrinkle-free); turtle neck; polo shirt
- pants: slacks or chinos
- shoes: street shoes or loafers
- colognes: moderate use
- facial hair: clean shaven or trimmed beards

#### WOMEN

- Blouses: collared and buttoned
- Shirts: crew-neck; no plunging necklines
- Sweaters
- Jewelry: minimal use
- Perfume: moderate use
- Skirts: knee-length or longer
- Pants: solid colors
- Shoes: flat-heeled or small-heeled
- Makeup: moderate use

These items are, generally, not acceptable in the Nuclear Medicine Department;

- jeans
- sweatshirts
- mini-skirts
- t-shirts
- sneakers
- open-toed shoes

*Remember: the overriding principle in the dress code is: do I look like a professional?*
