WFB013 Intro to Wildlife Tracking

This course is about you, and the tracker within you. Awareness of humanity's inherited capacity and disposition to track promotes an enhanced connection with one's self and the earth. *'Anything, Anywhere, Anytime'* through the lens of *'awareness'*. (1 credit)



WFB014 Wildlife Trail Analysis

This course is about following trails to read wildlife gait patterns in concert with the energetics of the landscape and factors influencing the evolution of animal locomotion, to enhance our connection with each animal species. *'The Locomotive – Landscape Duet'* through the lens of *'flow'*. (1 credit)



WFB015 Wildlife Track Analysis

This course is about reading the tracks to uncover detailed evidence of the story that occurred. Patterns of wildlife behavior unfold to promote enhanced connections with each animal studied. *'The Story of Forces vs. Forcing the Story'* through the lens of *'force'*. (1 credit)



WFB195 Winter Tracking Specialty

This course is about finding, following and becoming a part of the forest's story over four consecutive days. Experiences are shared using narrative and scientific forms of communication and synthesized into an overall picture of daily forest life that enhances our connection with the lineage and traditions of ancient trackers. *'The Landscape of Story'* through the lens of *'contemplation'*. (2 credit)

WFB195 Tracking Wildlife Corridors

This course is about identifying and interpreting the totality of landscape influence upon wildlife movement for habitat connectivity. A wildlife corridor is investigated on the Western slopes of the Green Mountains and an enhanced connection with Vermont's landscape and apex species is discovered. *'Landscape Large – Landscape Small'* through the lens of *'place'*. (1 credit)
