Consider ways Libraries' participation can benefit your proposal and project.

Collections

- ❖ Are there specific journals, databases or other resources you need to ensure the success of your project?
- ❖ Professional librarians can help review the current collection and make suggestions about additional materials.

Research

- ❖ Professional librarians offer curricular and research support in many forms.
- ❖ Individualized research consultations, formal library instruction, and specialized workshops may enhance your proposal and count towards an in-kind budgetary match.
- ❖ Librarians can create subject-specific guides, course-related websites, and other tools.

Dissemination

- ❖ The Libraries can include your research and reports in our online catalog and/or digital library, making grant results available to the UVM community and beyond.
- ❖ Librarians are available to assist you with identifying open access sources for publication.

Libraries involvement may take the form of budgetary allocation or in-kind match, depending on the extent of services provided.
