Dear Publisher,

Thank you for your attention to the enclosed submission. This article is based on research at the University of Vermont and State Agricultural College that is funded in whole or in part by grants from the National Institute of Health (NIH) and is therefore subject to the mandatory NIH Public Access policy (see <http://publicaccess.nih.gov/policy.htm>). As a matter of US federal regulation, the final, peer-reviewed manuscript must be deposited with the PubMed Central (PMC) database upon acceptance for publication and be made publicly accessible no later than 12 months after publication.

To ensure compliance with this mandate and to be sure that copyrights are addressed appropriately, we ask that

EITHER

You, as the publisher, submit the article directly to PubMed Central after acceptance. The list of journals which submit final published articles to PubMed Central is at: [http://publicaccess.nih.gov/submit\\_process\\_journals.htm#journals](http://publicaccess.nih.gov/submit_process_journals.htm#journals). In this case, we need only ask that the authors be informed when submission is complete so that they may obtain the required reference number(s) to be used in subsequent NIH applications,

OR

The publication contract, when and if the article is accepted for publication, includes language that allows the authors to retain the right to deposit the article with the PubMed Database as required. Please indicate clearly if you have any requirements about when, within the allowable 12 month period, the article can be made public through PMC.

If the necessary language is not part of your standard publication agreement or copyright transfer, please include this additional wording, which is suggested by the NIH:

*“The Journal acknowledges that Author retains the right to provide a copy of the final manuscript to the NIH upon acceptance for Journal publication for public archiving in PubMed Central as soon as possible but no later than 12 months after publication by Journal.”*

It is our hope that one of these options will be employed to ensure that we can comply with this mandate. Since this is a requirement of the current and future NIH funding which supports a great deal of research at our University, we must ensure that our authors comply with the public access policy. If you accept this article for publication and none of the above options have been implemented, we will ask our authors to include the italicized passage above from the NIH as an additional term of any contract they sign.
