AND art painting [any of these] (used ? for truncation to get german, germany, expressionism, expressionist, etc.)</i>	<i>86 books, some in German. Many were on target, but not all. Looked at the subject headings for some of the books and found a good subject heading: expressionism art germany. then did a subject heading search in Quick Search</i>	<i>Pretty productive search. Good idea to try both types of searches. Some overlap but I found books that I wouldn't have found otherwise, just using one type of search.</i>
<i>Oct 24</i>	<i>Articles on German Expressionist art during the Weimar period.</i>	<i>Academic Search Premier</i>	<i>Terms: german* AND expressionis* AND art or painting</i>	<i>294 hits but some citations were for book reviews and some were not in English. Set limits to English language and document type: Article. That narrowed my results to 197. Then I noticed that "expressionism" was a subject heading, so I changed the field label to "subject terms" for expressionis*. That narrowed by results to 66</i>	<i>This worked well as a starting point. But since 197 isn't a big number, I may go back and look at all the article citations that were a result of the first narrowing process. I found one great 6 page article in Architectural Digest from 1996, but I'd like to find a good article in a scholarly journal too. I think I'll try Historical Abstracts and then find a database for Art specifically.</i>
