Rahmatallah Gheshm, Post doc, Univ. of Rhode Island, has many years of experience growing saffron in Iran, and has done research at URI for 3 years.

Arash Ghalehgolabbehbahani, Research Assoc., **UVM**, has been working on several research projects to develop the potential of growing saffron for farmers.

Brian Leven, Golden Thread Farm, has been growing saffron for 3 years in the field and within high tunnels in northern VT.

Jeff Marstaller, Cozy Acres Greenhouses produces greenhouse ornamentals, and 3 years ago started growing saffron in tubs in his greenhouse in North Yarmouth, ME.

Patti & John Padua, Cobble Creek Nursery, have been growing saffron in the field for 3 years to diversify their nursery production, and their yields keep growing.

Parker Shorey, Lemonfair Saffron, VT saffron grower and marketer, launched his saffron company in Dec. 2019, selling saffron online and in NYC.

Gregg Stevens, Senior Certification Spec., **NOFAVT**, will discuss what is involved with certifying saffron as organic for Vermont.
