2008-09 Preseason Notebook:

- Vermont returns four starters and nine letterwinners from a team that reached the America East Semifinals last year. After knocking off host Binghamton in the quarterfinals, Vermont fell to top seeded and eventual champ UMBC in the semifinals.
- Leading the returnees for Vermont is junior **Marqus Blakely**. Blakely was named the America East Kevin Roberson Player of the Year and America East Defensive Player of the Year last season. He led the conference in points, rebounds and blocks and earned a spot on the all-conference first team and all-defensive team. Blakely is the first player in league history to earn both major awards in the same season and was one of only two players in the nation to win their conference player and defensive player of the year awards this season.
- Senior **Mike Trimboli** returns for his final season on campus ranked as one of the school's all-time leaders in both scoring and assists. Trimboli's 1,496 points through three seasons are the third-best pace in school history behind only Eddie Benton (1,838 points) and Taylor Coppentrath (1,665). He is also fourth in career assists, only 108 short of breaking the school record as he is looking to try and become only the fourth Catamount to lead the team in assists for four straight seasons, joining Kenny White '92, Eddie Benton '96 and David Roach '00.
- Senior **Colin McIntosh** and sophomore **Evan Fjeld** will look to play bigger roles this season. McIntosh is the team's third-leading returning scorer after averaging 6.9 points a game last year. Fjeld had an injury-plagued freshman season but still made 15 starts, scoring 5.5 per game.
- Vermont will have five newcomers on its 2008-09 roster including junior **Maurice Joseph**, a Michigan State transfer who sat out last season, and freshman **Pat Bergmann**, a 6-foot-10 forward who was a redshirt last year. They will be joined by true freshmen **Jordan Clarke** (6-foot-7, Rockville, Md./Our Lady Good Counsel), **Garvey Young** (6-foot-4, Washington, D.C./Georgetown Prep) and **Greg Hughes** (6-foot-1, West Rutland, Vt./West Rutland).
- Vermont has been the top team in America East over the last seven years in terms of wins, as the Catamounts are 86-30 in regular season league play. Boston University is second at 83-33. During the time frame Vermont has won three America East Championships and three regular season crowns.

Mike Lonergan • Head Coach

Catholic '88

Overall: 305-128 (15 years) • At Vermont: 54-40, Fourth season

Mike Lonergan enters his fourth year at Vermont, as the former Maryland assistant and Catholic University head coach is poised to lead UVM to another strong performance in 2008-09.

The Catamounts are coming off a 16-15 record in 2007-08 and finished fourth in the America East with a 9-7 league mark. Lonergan earned his 300th career victory during the season in an 81-76 win on the road against Hartford.

Under Lonergan's tutelage sophomore Marqus Blakely was named the Kevin Roberson America East Player of the Year and the America East Defensive Player of the Year. Blakely became the first player in league history to win both awards in the same season and was one of only two players in the nation to bring home both conference awards last season.

Lonergan guided Vermont to a mark of 25-8 overall in 2006-07 and won the America East Regular Season Championship with a 15-1 league mark. The Catamounts tied the school record for wins in a season and advanced to the postseason National Invitation Tournament (NIT) for the first time in school history. Vermont also tied for the national lead in road/neutral site victories with 16 and enjoyed a 13-game winning streak.

Lonergan led Vermont to its first victory over a ranked opponent in the regular season as the Catamounts shocked No. 14 Boston College, 77-63, in Chestnut Hill, Mass. on Nov. 13, 2006. Following the season he was named the America East Coach of the Year, the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District I Coach of the Year, ColleagueInsider.com America East Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year.

With Vermont heading back to the America East Championship game during the 2006-07 season for the fifth straight season, Lonergan became the first coach in the conference since Karl Fogel of Northeastern in 1986-87 to take his team to back-to-back title game appearances in his first two years with a school. Two of his former players, Martin Klimes and Chris Holm, are now playing professionally in Spain.

In 2005-06, Lonergan led the Catamounts, the least-experienced team in the nation, to the America East Championship game in his first season with at Vermont. He became the third first-year coach in conference history to take his team to the title game.

Lonergan, 42, who also spent three years as an assistant coach at Colgate, is the 15th head coach in the 106-year history of basketball at UVM and the sixth since 1940. He succeeded Tom Brennan, who retired in March of 2005 after 19 years as head coach at Vermont.

Lonergan spent the 2004-05 season on Gary Williams' staff at Maryland as the Terrapins reached the NIT semifinals at Madison Square Garden in New York. The Terps defeated Duke twice during the regular season, including a 75-66 victory on the road that ended the Blue Devils 15-game winning streak. Duke was ranked second in the nation at the time.

Prior to his stint at Maryland, he led Catholic to seven consecutive NCAA Division III tournament appearances and nine overall from 1992 to 2004. He compiled a 251-88 (.740) record during his 12-year tenure at Catholic and his squad averaged nearly 25 victories per season over his last seven years. The Cardinals were 88-10 (.898) in Capital Athletic Conference regular-season play during that time. He was the only coach in the nation in any division to win the regular season conference title each year in the seven-year span from 1998 to 2004, and he was honored for that feat at the NABC Champions Luncheon during the 2004 Final Four. He was also the nation's only coach to lead his team to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen each year between 1998 and 2002.

A 1988 Catholic graduate, Lonergan earned a B.A. in history and went on to attain a master's degree in criminal justice at American International College in Springfield, Mass., while working as an assistant coach for the Yellow Jackets during the 1988-89 season.

Before returning to his alma mater, he served as an assistant coach at Colgate for three seasons from 1989-1992. He served as the top recruiter for his former college coach, the late Jack Bruen, who was named Patriot League Coach of the Year in Lonergan's final season with the Red Raiders.

Lonergan was the head coach at Catholic from the 1992-93 to 2003-04 seasons, leading the Cardinals to nine of the 13 NCAA appearances in the history of the program highlighted by the 2001 NCAA Division III Championship. His success at CU included graduating 100 percent of his players while taking on Division I foes such as Princeton, American, Davidson and William & Mary. Catholic's victory over Albany in 2000 was the program's first over a Division I school since 1981. He also coached a Division III All-American in each of his last five seasons at Catholic.

After leading the Cardinals to the 2001 NCAA title, Lonergan was

the consensus choice as Division III National Coach of the Year picking up the award from the NABC, Molten Division III News and D3Hoops.com. He also received the Presidents Medal at Catholic University - the highest honor awarded by his alma mater, in 2004. In 2005 he was inducted into the Catholic University Hall of Fame.

Two of Lonergan's former players at Catholic are now playing professionally. Matt Hilleary, who named All-Tournament at the 2001 NCAA Division III Final Four, plays in Italy, and Patrick Dwyer is playing in England.

Prior to college, Lonergan was a standout athlete and a graduate of Archbishop Carroll High School in Washington, D.C., where he was also the class salutatorian. He graduated from Catholic in 1988 with a B.A. in history. As a senior co-captain and starting point guard, he helped guide the team to a mark of 18-8, averaging 8.5 points, 5.2 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 2.3 steals. In 1985-86, the three-year starter helped the Cards (19-8) win the ECAC South Region Tournament.

Lonergan was raised in a very athletic family. His father, Jack, was a left-handed pitcher at Holy Cross who hurled on the Crusaders' 1952 NCAA College World Series championship team. His late mother, Maureen, was a legendary coach and athletic director at Seton High School in Bladensburg, Md. where the playing fields are named in her honor.

In addition to his work on the court, Lonergan has also been active in community and professional organizations. He is a member of the NABC, has served as a spokesperson for the America Cancer Society's Coaches vs. Cancer program, was co-chairman of the Coaches vs. Cancer Three-Point Shootout Committee, and has volunteered with the Special Olympics. A board member of the St. Gabriel Parish Youth Organization and the Knights of Columbus, he was also a member of the Catholic University Alcohol Awareness Advisory Committee.

A native of Bowie, Md., Lonergan is married to the former Maggie Meagher, who until March of 2005 was the women's basketball coach at Catholic and led the Cardinals to a 20-7 record in 2004-05. They have four children - a son, Jack who is eight, a daughter, Margaret who is seven, and sons Michael, Jr. who is two, and Robert who was just born this past season.

2007-08 Season-In-Review

Vermont finished the 2007-08 season with a 16-15 overall mark and went 9-7 in America East play, as the Catamounts earned the fourth seed for the America East Championship. After knocking off host Binghamton in the quarterfinals, Vermont fell to top seeded and eventual champ UMBC in the semifinals.

NATIONALLY RANKED: Marqus Blakely finished fifth in the nation in rebounding (11.0 rpg), 15th in blocks (2.7 bpg), 43rd in both steals (2.0 spg) and field goal percentage (55.0), and 51st in scoring (19.0 ppg). Mike Trimboli finished with the 27th-best free throw percentage (86.4), was 75th in scoring (17.9 ppg) and 84th in assists (4.5 apg).

1,000 POINT CLUB: Mike Trimboli moved into seventh place all-time in school history in scoring after leading the Cats with 556 points scored during his junior season, giving him 1,496 for his career. With 22 points in the win over NJIT on November 20, Trimboli became the 27th Catamount in the history of the program to top the 1,000-point mark. Trimboli needed 16 going into the game and reached that in the first half by shooting a perfect 7-for-7 from the floor. He becomes the first Catamount since T.J. Sorrentine '05 to accomplish the feat. Trimboli's 1,496 points through three seasons are the third-best pace in school history behind only Eddie Benton (1,838 points) and Taylor Copenrath (1,665).

HELPING HAND: With two assists in a loss to New Hampshire on February 28, Mike Trimboli moved into fourth place all-time in school history, passing Eddie Benton '96 (458). Trimboli handed out 166 assists in each of his first two seasons and for his career now has 471. Kenny White '92 is the all-time leader with 565. Trimboli has led the team in assists in each of his first three years on campus and is looking to try and become only the fourth Catamount to lead the team in assists for four straight seasons, joining White, Eddie Benton '96 and David Roach '00.

MILESTONE VICTORY: UVM head coach Mike Lonergan earned career win number 300 with an 81-76 victory at Hartford on January 30. Lonergan is 54-40 at Vermont in three seasons, after going 251-88 during a 12-year tenure at Catholic University.

THREE FOR ONE: Vermont swept the season series against Binghamton this past year, earning a 71-60 victory in Burlington on January 3, taking a 83-78 decision in Vestal on February 6 and then defeating the Bearcats in the America East Quarterfinals, 65-57. The Catamounts have defeated an opponent three times in the same season on 10 different occasions all-time.

20 OR MORE: Mike Trimboli surpassed the 20-point mark 12 times this past season. For his career Vermont is now 22-5 when he goes over 20, which included a perfect 11-0 mark during his sophomore season.

LEAGUE PLAY: Vermont has been the top team in America East over the last seven years in terms of wins, as the Catamounts are 86-30 in regular season league play. Boston University is second at 83-33. During the time frame Vermont has won three America East Championships and three regular season crowns.

DOUBLE-TROUBLE: Marqus Blakely recorded 10 straight double-doubles during a stretch during the regular season, which was the most in the modern era for the Cats. Blakely was one of only 19 players in the nation to average a double-double. The Cats went 9-6 on the year when he posted a double-double. Trevor Gaines '02 holds the school single-season record with 17 double-doubles.

SELECT COMPANY: With his big effort against Hartford on February 20, Marqus Blakely became only the second player in the nation to score at least 30 points and pull down at least 20 rebounds in the same contest last season. He joined Kansas State freshman Michael Beasley who went for 32 and 24 in his first collegiate game against Sacramento State.

SENIOR SALUTE: The loss against UMBC in the America East Semifinals marked the final contest for Catamount seniors Kyle Cieplicki, Timothy McCrory and Chad Powlovich. This group helped lead Vermont to the America East Championship game three times, an appearance in the NCAA Tournament as freshmen and the team's first-ever postseason NIT as juniors.

NEW ENGLAND'S BEST: Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Catamounts have the third-most wins (143) among the 20 Division I schools in New England, trailing only Connecticut (177) and Boston College (150). Vermont also joins UConn and BC as the only schools in New England with at least five 20+ win seasons over the last seven years.

TEAM AWARDS: The Catamounts handed out their team awards at the end of the season, with Marqus Blakely taking home the top honor as the MVP. Mike Trimboli earned the Thomas M. O'Shea Award, which was established after the 1986-87 season and given to that individual with exemplary dedication, courage and commitment to the program. Freshman Evan Fjeld wrapped up the awards by being named the team's top rookie.
