- Other people if they live with and receive more than half of their support from your parents at this time and will continue to receive that support from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013

One parent household:

- List the UVM student
- List the custodial* parent

***Definition of a Custodial Parent for FAFSA reporting:**

The **custodial parent** is the parent whose information should be reported on the FAFSA. The definition of custodial parent for purposes of the FAFSA is the parent with whom the student lived for more of the 12 month period preceding the filing of the FAFSA. If the student lived with each parent equally, or with neither parent at all, the custodial parent is considered to be the parent who provided more financial support to the student. The non-custodial parent should not be included on this form, and his/her financial information is not reviewed.
