## • Fuels: Biodiesel "Green Coach" Tour

A national biodiesel bus tour launched by the Udall Foundation will highlight innovative initiatives underway in cities, Native American communities, national parks, and college campuses. The bus is the first motor coach certified by UVM's "Green Coach Certification" program and runs on B20 (a fuel blend of 20% biodiesel and 80% petroleum diesel). The bus's emissions will be monitored by the University Transportation Center at UVM. On-board hardware will output real-time data accessible online here. ### Bike & Ped: Ped Progress (Hinesburg)

Hinesburg's presentation of their rezoning efforts to concentrate growth in their village center and improve pedestrian-friendliness of the town was met with approval by residents at a recent public forum. [Source: Burlington Free Press]

Bike & Ped: Multi-Use Path Update (St. Johnsbury)

The long-awaited Three Rivers Transportation Path was recently subjected to another planning delay. The town will be holding a public meeting on June 11 to inform the public as to what has been done over the last 22 months, and discuss alternative versions (see Events below). Alternative Modes: Rail Spur Plans Continue (Middlebury)

Omya continues to consider investing in a rail spur which would reduce truck traffic on Route 7. A hearing is being held on June 6 (see Events below). The project's environmental impact statement can be viewed at Middlebury Town Offices and the Isley Public Library. Copies have also been sent to the town offices of Salisbury, Leicester, Brandon, Pittsford, Whiting, and Cornwall as potentially affected Route 7 communities. It is also available online here. Alternative Modes: Rail Linkages Proposed Between States

The governors of Connecticut and Massachusetts have been discussing a rail line extension which would connect Hartford to Springfield. Vermont has also expressed interest in further extending the line into this state. [Source: The Republican]

No Idling: School Bus Idling Ban Passed

With the passage of the School Bus Idling bill, schools are projected to save \$300,000 that would have otherwise been spent on fuel for idling buses. The law also encourages development of a model policy to encourage school districts to restrict idling on school grounds by all vehicles. Policy Watch: VTrans Planning Update

More than 100 people recently engaged in an all-day working session exploring strategies to cope with different scenarios of the future, including those where gas prices rise above \$9.00 a gallon or where there are major weather disruptions from climate change. The "scenario planning" exercise was led by RSG Inc. and the Snelling Center for Government on behalf of the Vermont Agency of Transportation to inform its Long Range Transportation Business Plan.
