- Fuels: Compressed natural gas

The University of Vermont has brought two compressed natural gas buses online as part of its campus area transportation fleet. It will add four more by the fall of next year. Senator Patrick Leahy, the Federal Transit Administration, the City of Burlington, and Vermont Gas Systems Inc. helped make this possible. Pollution reductions are projected to be 100 times lower for particulate matter, and 50% less nitrogen oxides than from a typical bus. [Source: [UVM](#)]

Among other fleet owners, at least 12 municipalities throughout Vermont have made the switch to biodiesel and are reporting good results. These include Brattleboro, Brownsville, Burlington, Danville, Enosburg, Enosburg Falls, Groton, Hartford, Manchester, Norwich, Thetford, West Brookfield. A New York-based start-up company has purchased property in New York along the Vermont border in order to build a biodiesel plant. Current issues include security concerns, unsightliness, and a poor entrance. 50 vehicle-capacity is anticipated post-renovation.
