Executive Report (01:04:24)

 - Chair Burns: will there be any planning committee or a chance for the Senate body to assist in the planning for the naked bike ride?
- President Goflarini: we'll talk later about that.
- Chair caster: In your conversation with Andy Stevens and the Naked Bike Ride, was there a mention of the rule of a reading day discussed?
- President Goflarini suggest speaking to him one on one about his conversation with Andy Stevens, but he does not want to say anything about the issue just yet to the Senate body, because nothing is final and it's still in the works. Nevertheless, he does share that one of the potential concerns for next years' Naked Bike Ride was the reading day in between the Naked Bike Ride and the exam day, that is why there has been so many excessive drinking on the day of the Naked Bike Ride. So there is a possibility of the reading day being taken away.

Committee Reports (00:49:25)

Finance: Budgets came out today.

- They are going to send out the budgets for clubs to Senate once the budgets become finalized
- They also had some supplemental.
- Chair Burns: Can you clarify on your final decisions pertaining to certain budget cuts?
- Chair Dougherty: After going back and looking at the process, because last week there were eleven clubs who did not sign up for budget hearing. After having conversation with Pat Brown and Blanka, they determined that the process was wrong. This was the first year that they had electronic budgets, so no club had handed a paper copy, which was a problem because there was no interaction between people of Senate and the club signers who would direct the clubs requesting over \$15,000 for a budget hearing time. Because that didn't happen, clubs just forgot and didn't do it. As well as, Sarah was not aware that she had to do that. And because the system was flawed, no percentage was deducted from any budgets.
- Senator Campbell: commends Chair Dougherty for how he handled the situation and offers him a hug.
- Chair Dougherty denies the offer, but appreciates Campbell's compliments. Dougherty also offers his compliments to Senate for asking the questions they did during last Senate meeting.

COLA: Obama is coming to UVM!

- The tickets are \$44 for students
- Police Luncheon is on March 14th from 12-1:30
- Community Coalition meets on Friday March 17th.
- They did a type of funding similar to Senator Keenan’s Resolution Level Funding and they sent it to the state house. If people want to hear more about that, Senator Rifken would love to talk to them.
- Police funding resolutions from last week. They’re following up on conversations.
- Senator Keenan and Chair Rifken are working on priority registration and they are going to be meeting with neighbors soon.
- If anybody wants to hear about Montpelier, Chair Rifken has the pictures and PowerPoint
- Chair Goodnow: Is there any way you can look into lowering prices for students with financial need?
 - Chair Rifken: They have been talking to Federal Relations for trying to get something for students. It’s hard because it is a campaign event.
 - Speaker Osef: Is it the campaign that is asking for \$44?
 - Vice President Vitagliano: The Obama Campaign is renting the space for the Gutterson Field House. It is not associated with UVM, because UVM has to remain neutral when it comes to campaigning. UVM is not setting that price; it’s the campaign.
 - COLA: It was actually \$100 to go, but they reduced it to \$44 for students and activists.
 - Senator Casey: We are trying to arrange something along the lines of “Meet and Greet,” which is outside of the campaign and where students would not have to pay, since the university cannot be affiliated with the campaign.
- Chair Burns: Can President Obama come and speak to SGA in a non-campaign way?
- Senator Casey: That would be pretty difficult, and not really that realistic. They have not gotten his schedule, but it is pretty much booked to my understanding.
- Senator Mansfield: Would you like me to present anything to the education chair?
 - Chair Rifken: Once we have our resolution, yes, the more people the better.

Academic Affairs: received an email from Julie Roberts, who is the president of faculty senate, who said something along the lines of in order to reduce the misbehaviors associated with the naked bike ride, the administration is contemplating removing the first “reading day” and instead of giving its students Fall break instead.

- They are still contemplating advising.

- Senator Campbell has drafted a letter to David Shiman, who is the president of the United Academics, so they can have a conversation about enhanced section description, since a lot of the faculty is on the fence about that.
- As far as the resolution goes, Chair Caster will be sending that out to the necessary representatives and whoever becomes the chair of Academic Affairs next year, he has already scheduled a meeting on April 19th for that person with Jane O'Dell and he, himself.

Student Action: Tiksmoeff. He encourages people to comment on the Tiksmoeff that he presents to senate. He received a Tiksmoeff last night concerning nutrition information being specifically posted on the unlimited dining halls. He will be working on that. There was another Tiksmoeff for a change in food options in the Late Night Dinners at Harris Millis. There were also concerns from the students about the appropriation of the Senate executive branch election in running for their position. They want to see a clean fight. So he suggests maybe a meeting with all the candidates after the papers have been signed. Senator Chaouch clarifies that the meeting already takes place. There were also two Tiksmoeff about its name, because they felt that it was instigating a negative connotation to the comments. So Chair Goodnow is going to speak to Vice President Vitagliano about changing the name of that in the website.

- He wants to change the area where Senate posts its legislation to near the Market Place. They are going to be working with Public Relations about that.

- He has been working on the transition binder for the next chair of Student Action.
- Chair Rifken: sent Chair Goodnow an email about UVM rideshare.

- Social Justice Retreat for the ALANA Student Center, he hopes that everybody received his email.
- The International Day—Senator Craine has been working on that, and CODEE is thinking about putting together an ad-hoc committee to start planning this.
- Student talked to Chair Burns about his concern with Sodexo food, wanting more local food. He is going to be working with that student
- He talks about “Kids for Peace,” and how they might sponsor some students to go to the event. If there are any questions, then talk to Senator Al-Namee
