The goal of my summer research was to volunteer my time and skills at Public Assets Institute (PAI) in Montpelier, Vermont. PAI is a nonprofit group that works to provide information about state, local, and national government in a non-partisan manner that ordinary Vermont residents can understand. As a political science major, I am concerned with the low level of democratic participation in our society; Public Assets attempts to raise this participation level. It researches government policy proposals, analyzes fiscal decisions, and publishes these updates on its website. As a supplement to the website, open-editorials, radio interviews, speaking tours, and press releases give information to citizens without an internet connection.

The core topics I worked on were preparing the State of Working Vermont 2011

Report, monthly jobs briefs, and research about 'Tax Flight' and 'Brain Drain' in Vermont.
