- An <u>online course</u>, designed and taught by policy experts at MIT, provides an introduction to the policymaking process and practical tips for engaging with the policy community.
- The <u>Engaging Scientists & Engineers in Policy</u> (ESEP) Coalition empowers scientists and engineers to effectively engage in the policy making process at all levels of government (international, federal, state and local).
