Team Science and Social Networks

The Science of Team Science is an emerging “interdisciplinary field that empirically examines the processes by which large and small scientific teams, research centers, and institutes organize, communicate, and conduct research (<https://www.nationalacademies.org/our-work/the-science-of-team-science>).”

- A key part is to understand how teams collaborate and develop relationships to improve and enhance science.
- Social Network Analysis (SNA) focuses on team collaboration and relationships among people.
- Focuses on the structure, patterns, and implications of the relationships that join people.
 - Who is included, who is not, how are people included etc.?





Collaborative Potential

Descriptive analyses suggest some growth in collaboration since 2018.

In 2020 there were still many solo-authored papers but an increase in multi-authored submissions. There is more clustering of research related to the function of the work – i.e., research, extension, practitioner etc.

The 2022 conference was multi-modally delivered and saw participation and collaboration from all over the world.

Evaluation is ongoing but there is evidence of an increase in collaboration and engagement in the 2022 results

Growing your network

Workshop to enhance networking skills during the 2022 Agritourism Conference.

The workshop was a hybrid structure, accommodating both in-person and virtual attendees.

Attendance was capped at 30 - 20 in-person and 10 virtual.

All interested parties completed a simple application

100 individuals expressed interest- 87 in-person, 13 virtual.
