

High Meadow Farm, owned and operated by Howard and Lisa Prussack, was established in 1971—the first certified organic farm in Vermont! Since then, we have been taking care of our soil and growing the highest quality organic produce. Now we focus on growing winter squash, onions, garlic, tomatoes, herbs, potted plants, carrots and turnips. In 2013, we finished a major renovation of our barn, creating a bright and pleasant, four-season "solarium" wash and pack area on the first floor. This renovation allows us to retain one or more year-round employees, while improving our productivity, product shelf-life and food safety standards!








How to Participate in 2017 CAPS

- Explore capsvt.org for free
- Use CAPS with VVBGA membership (\$35)
- For CAPS Accreditation, Draft/revise produce safety plan by April 1, and pay \$100 CAPS fee. (financial assistance available)
- Finalize plan by June1
- Train Employees by July 15
- Finish CAPS by Nov. 1-- \rightarrow December 15.
- CAPS is pending for 2017, valid through 2018
