TEACHING EXPERIENCE **Equus** Fall and Spring 2016-present
ASCI 121/2400, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Experiential learning course focused on equine husbandry skills and general horsemanship. Assignments are a mix of student presentations (group and individual) as well as a semester long research project with a written paper and presentation as an outcome. Students are divided into groups of 3 and assigned a horse to care for throughout the entire semester.

Horse Barn Coop Fall and Spring 2016-present, Summer 2018 and 2022
ASCI 021/1450, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Faculty Barn Manager for student cooperative barn; oversee weekly student meetings; meet weekly with farm facility staff and faculty; resolve disputes between students; act as liaison between students and department; discuss equine care and management, nutrition, horse health, current events, and safety protocols.

Horse Barn Executive Committee Fall and Spring 2016-2022
ASCI 129/2450, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
A group of Coop students are selected to be members of the Horse Barn Coop Executive Committee. Exec members are the managers of the barn. We meet weekly to discuss barn issues. Exec members are responsible for the paperwork in the barn, scheduling vet and farrier appointments, running Coop meeting, ordering feed and bedding. Each Exec member chairs one of the barn committees.

Equus Advising Fall and Spring 2016-2022
ASCI 191/2990 or ASCI 225/3400, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Students are responsible for overseeing the care and health of the 6 Animal Science teaching horses. In addition, these students schedule and teach riding lessons, provide

instruction during class time, oversee, and coordinate the completion of weekly chores, and are a liaison between Coop and Equus.

Equine Management and Programming

Fall 2022-present

ASCI 297/4990, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Faculty Barn Manager for student cooperative and teaching barn; oversee weekly executive meetings with the student barn-managers, Equus Advisors, and Dressage Team Captains; problem solve routine issues; schedule practitioners; review and revise essential documents, safety policies, and biosecurity protocols; collaborate with farm staff; maintain horse health, fitness, and welfare; assess nutritional needs, work with local vendors, and order feed for 22 horses; oversee and manage day-to-day chores; maintain 10 acres of pasture; determine and manage turn-out groups.

Equine Training Techniques

Fall 2016, 2018, 2020, and 2022

ASCI 119/2420, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Provides students an understanding of horse behavior as it pertains to shaping/modifying the desired response. This class presents fundamental training techniques for working with horses of all ages and levels of training but focuses mainly on starting the young horse and teaching that individual the “basics/fundamentals”.

Equine Instructing Techniques

Spring 2018, 2020, and 2022

ASCI 125/2430, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Hands-on course focused on discussing, observing, and practicing horseback riding teaching skills in a classroom and barn setting; students prepare instructing journals including lesson plans, safety protocols, daily schedules and self and student created evaluations. There is an emphasis on safety, classic position, clear communication with the horse, group vs. individual lessons, and ring etiquette.

Beginner Horseback Riding

Spring 2018, 2020, and 2022

ASCI 030/1410, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Horseback riding instruction for students with little or no riding experience. Animal Science horses are used to teach basic position and gaits. Student instructors are utilized to provide an additional teaching opportunity. Safety and control are emphasized.

Intermediate Horseback Riding

Spring 2018, 2020, and 2022

ASCI 130/2410, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Horseback riding instruction for students comfortable at the walk, trot, and canter. Animal Science horses are used to teach more advanced skills, such as riding with an independent seat. Student instructors are utilized to provide an additional teaching opportunity. Safety and control are emphasized.

Equine Enterprise Management

Fall 2017, 2019, and 2021

ASCI 108/2470, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont

Students learn about all aspects of equine farm management and operation. Topics include: safety, horse welfare, horse health management, vital signs, biosecurity, quarantine, daily horse care, purchasing and feeding grain, hay, and supplements, equine nutrition, blanketing for the barn and turn-out, leg and hoof safety, stall cleaning, bedding, flooring, facility management and layout / design, facility maintenance, pasture management, fencing, layout, and design, facility lighting, ventilation and heat, arena footing and maintenance, paperwork (i.e. sales contracts, board agreements, risk release, farm rules, applications, etc.) and insurance.

Equine Industry Issues

Spring 2017, 2019, and 2021

ASCI 108/2470, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
This upper-level elective course dives into equine industry issues at a local, regional, and national level. The following topics are covered: equine welfare, insurance, taxes, purchase and lease agreements, commission, land use, waste management and water protection, trainer certification, farm management issues, and rules & regulations for horse sports. Students complete research, present projects, and participate in a debate.

Farm Animal Management

Spring 2023

ASCI 191D/2990, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Students learn about all aspects of farm animal management and operations for a range of farm species. Topics include: safety, welfare, health management, vital signs, biosecurity, quarantine, daily care, animal nutrition and nutrient requirements for each species, exercise requirement for each species, routine animal health needs, stall / cage / pen cleaning, bedding, flooring, facility management, layout & design, facility maintenance, pasture management, fencing, facility lighting, ventilation and heat, arena footing and maintenance, paperwork (i.e. sales contracts, board agreements, risk release, farm rules, applications, etc.), required agriculture practices, and insurance.

Lecture on Equine Behavior

Fall 2018-Spring 2023

ASCI 001/1000, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Lecture on equine body language, behavior, and communication; highlight equine courses offered; provide an overview of equine careers.

Lecture on Equine Identification

Fall 2023

ASCI 001/1000, Department of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, University of Vermont
Lecture on equine identification including colors, markings, and breeds; provide an overview of equine courses offered at UVM.
