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## Center for Community News Announces its 2025 Champions

The 63 honorees are helping to forge a sustainable future for local news through university-led reporting programs

BURLINGTON, Vt. — The Center for Community News at the University of Vermont today recognized 63 CCN Champions for their work growing university-led reporting programs in their region. This year's cohort includes faculty, public media professionals and news leaders from institutions large and small.

"Student reporting has emerged as one critical solution to the crisis facing local news," said CCN Director Richard Watts. "The people running these news-academic partnerships are leading the next generation of courageous journalists, storytellers and civic leaders. We are honored to help amplify their work."

The CCN Champions awarded this year represent 25 different states. Thirty-three are faculty members from U.S. colleges and universities, ten represent student media programs that are filling critical gaps in local news coverage; and ten work for public media organizations.

Together, they are growing student news reporting at large flagship universities, HBCUs, community colleges, minority serving institutions and student-run news outlets.

Each CCN Champion will receive a \$1000 reward, peer support and coaching throughout the year. The program is led by CCN's Scott Finn in collaboration with Amanda Bright, Director of the Cox Institute Journalism Innovation Lab at the University of Georgia.



"This year, we've been able to expand the Champions program in number and scope," said Finn, who also helps run CCN's Vermont-based academic-news partnership. "The best way to grow these programs is to support the people behind them."
