Future Hopes/Plans: I will be continuing my education through Dartmouth College's Master of Public Health program. I am excited to keep learning and work toward a future of health equity!





Future Hopes/Plans: I will be taking a gap year while I apply to Physician Assistant schools.





Future Hopes/Plans: I hope to find a career path that combines what I've learned about health and policy here at UVM with my love of cooking and food.


