





## THE BODY REBELLIOUS: STAGING GRISELDA GAMBARO's THEATRE

A Talk by Claudio Medeiros Director and Professor of Theatre Middlebury College

Griselda Gambaro's dramaturgy tells stories where humanity's capacity for cruelty is exposed, and where resistance offers the audience a measure of hope. In this talk Medeiros investigates the challenges and opportunities that her dramas present the director and the actor, as a text in translation. How can the actor's body become a sign that communicates alongside Gambaro's heightened, poetic language? How can the director stage the rebellious body, the suffering body, or the body in extremis? Two student-actors will share a scene which they are currently rehearsing with Medeiros, from the Gambaro's drama The Walls.

He directed a wide range of plays among which are A Midsummer Night's Dream, Cabaret, One Flea Spare, Spring Awakening, Hecuba, Lotus Lives: A Multimedia Chamber Opera, and Bad Blood, a play by Argentinian playwright Griselda Gambaro, Medeiros holds a PhD in Theatre from the University of California at Berkeley.
