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Why the Navy??



- The Navy offers a variety of opportunities:
 - Aviation
 - Undersea medicine
 - Traditional medical roles
 - *Land-based*
 - *Ships*
 - *Marine Corps commands*
 - Humanitarian missions
 - Duty stations in metropolitan areas near the COASTS!!



What is the Offer?

- Full tuition scholarship
- \$20,000 sign on bonus for 4 year commitment
- \$2,870 monthly stipend

What is Active Duty Training (ADT)?



- As HPSP Student, you are a Navy Reservist
- We understand that your primary mission is med school.
- You are required to serve 6 weeks of active-duty time per year
 - *Some students goes to ODS*
 - *Most students take school orders and remain in medical school*
 - *MS3s & MS4s often do Audition Rotations at Navy residency sites*
- While on ADT orders, you will receive full active-duty pay and allowances.
- Will I be called up to do anything else while in medical school? ---
NO! your job is to become the best doctor you can be.



What is Officer Development School?



- 5 Weeks of training in Newport, RI
- Your first step in your professional development as a Naval Officer
- Provides familiarization with customs, courtesies, and traditions of Naval service.
- Significantly less intense than boot camp as portrayed in Hollywood.



Residency



- As an HPSP recipient, must apply to civilian and military residency match. Both are highly competitive.
- Military Match results: *December*
- May be matched to 2 civilian options (*March Match*):
 - Navy Active Duty Delay for specialist (NADDS)- no Navy pay or benefits, no extra obligation.
 - Full Time Out Service (FTOS)- Pay/benefits as a Navy Lieutenant (O3)- additional service obligation

Citizenship: Must be a United States Citizen or Naturalized

Age: Must be commissioned before their 42nd birthday

GPA: Minimum 3.0 or higher

MCAT: Minimum score of 500 or above

AMCAS Application – MD schools

AACOMAS Application – DO Schools

TMDSAS to any medical school in Texas
