- Founded by the University of Michigan in the late 1980s, intergroup dialogue (IGD) is a
 pedagogical model centered around engaging individuals and groups across differences
- IGD in the Provost Academic Success Goals (Priority 3 Engagement)
 - 3.1.B. Develop learning opportunities and assess outcomes in intergroup dialogue for students, faculty and staff that improve civil discourse and civic engagement
- With a focus on dialogue and dialogic efforts more broadly, we've:
 - Hosted and collaborated on various workshops on dialogue and facilitation
 - Convened an IGD Community of Practice, incorporating principles into everyday work
 - Been selected for an AY 25-26 AAC&U PLC granting us campus-wide access to an online dialogue skills program called Perspectives
- Also co-lead University Intercultural Excellence Council and University Outreach Council

 - Sharing/loaning materials in our Intercultural Resource library (articles, books and videos)




UVM Interfaith Center
