Public Forum

Aurora Hurd Presenting on WAGE

- The WAGE Center cultivates connection, student success initiatives, collaboration, and community-focused building for faculty, staff, and students.
- Current and future events: welcome back party, partner with Mosaic center, coming in the spring: March: leaders of gender equity celebrate folks within the UVM community doing gender related work
- Advancing gender equity: men and masculinity programs, advisory council, Evan does a lot of work on student leadership, violence prevention, expanding outreach to masculine folks to retain them within UVM.

- Programs and collaborations
 - One arm is focused on community building, the other is focused on gender equity
 (infused through everything)
- The WAGE Center thinks of itself as a soft place to land for students, staff, and faculty.

 The organization aims to make things homier with a full kitchen, living room, a rental private space (appointments and interviews), food pantry, snack cart, free printing (color, as well as black and white), gender neutral bathroom, safe sex supplies, free menstrual products, work study jobs (expanding to internships), and craft supplies
- Mental health resources: Lets talk, satellite advising, meet and greet at the career center,
 holding space times where the house smells nice with a relaxing atmosphere with care
 team drop in hours in October, book club, film screenings, teaching people how to use the
 pin maker, book club in partnership with mosaic center, family dinner at the end of the
 semester
- Keep in contact with students through a Newsletter, social media
- Closing statement: come to wage to hang out, we are always here for you

Annie Stevens and Fran Cohen Presenting on Indivisible Chapter

- Retired from working at UVM, and now volunteers at Indivisible
- Local organization with a mission to preserve our federal government and oppose its dismantling, and to preserve democracy
- All volunteer-based organizations
- Started Champlian Valley Indivisible

- 500 local community members, more neighborhood issues focused, we are focused on Shelburne, South Burlington, Charlotte, St. Albans
- Burlington has Queen City indivisible
- The national chapter of Indivisible was started by two Senate staffers who wanted to raise attention about democracy
- We hold big and small events such as No Kings 2 in Burlington, South Burlington, and Williston that we host, all are welcome to those rallies
- Non-violent, peaceful organization, we bring joy to supporting our democracy
 - o Doing it in a very First Amendment free speech way
- One million rising community conversations held at local libraries, which focus on the questions of how do we talk to one another and how do we figure out what is going on
- If you wanna get involved in issues around our federal government, we work on elections, postcard writing, and social media
 - These are open to all of you to get the word out that these community events are happening. We want students to join us
- Fran is a member of Queen City Indivisible
- There are several chapters because they are neighborhood-based, they are popping up and growing, now there are 12 in Vermont
- Fran is here to talk about what they are doing in Queen City, they started in the fall
 - o Community and political action
 - We are working on another action on no kings 2, we are putting together a march that they want to gather people to walk down to city hall from the university

- There will be music and encouragement to buy stuff to honor Burlington and the struggle that they've been experiencing
- They want a contingent of students, meet at City Hall Park at noon on Saturday,
 October 18
- Really feel like it is important that all people are represented, acknowledge that young people are busy
- There are so many issues that you could represent going down to City Hall, such as the environment, unions, or healthcare

Ouestions

Chair Demeo: I canvassed for VPIRG and people mentioned this organization all the time. We would be happy to connect with some of the political clubs on campus and help you start a club for a chapter on campus to connect you with students

Vice President Modun: What methods have you been using to grow your membership

- Response Email for the local community, front porch forum. CFor champlain Valley Indivisible it started with honk and waves. We started with a Tesla takedown rally; from there, people started to join us. Our members would forward the weekly newsletter to a friend, which has been spreading like wildfire.
- For Queen City, we are doing much of the same thing, but we felt like we needed a young person to do social media. The organization got someone to do that, and we noticed people talking about an Instagram account

Senator Lee: Some recommendations or ideas: you should talk to the UVM Civic Engagement office, Aimee Alexander. Through student life, you could look at Davis Center tabling (which might be more difficult as an external person)

President Connors: You can email Will Sullivan to schedule for Davis Center tabling **President Connors**: I am curious about what current student participation looks like

- Response: Our organization is a lot of retired people, student participation right now is about 0. We will attend high schools as well, the idea of a student club that then partners with the chapter would be fantastic, and grants can come in from the national chapter. We want to partner – what do you need and what are we trying to do and how do we do that together.

Senator Saddiqui: What kind of safety and security would you be providing for international students?

Response: We partner with Migrant Justice to fight back on what ICE is doing, and we support local community members when they need safety and assistance. As far as being out in public, we can't promise anyone safety. We do have marshals that are trained in de-escalation for our events and Zoom meetings to talk about what to do if something happens. We do our best to educate folks on how to keep themselves safe. We are very non-violent, and we don't engage, which is one of this organization's tenets. We de-escalate whenever we can, but there is no guarantee

Senator York: Have you guys spoken with groups at Champlain College and Saint Michael's? We do have a lot of other passionate people in the area

Response: We are in contact with the Vice President at Champlain College, but the people at Saint Michael's haven't gotten back to me.

Senator Laychak: I would reach out to Civic Engagement and I encourage you to come to a community coalition meeting, which are once a month Friday 3-4:30 pm. A collection of UVM

officials and local leaders, and MPA leaders will be there. Our next one is October 17 from 3-4:30 at 12 Colchester Ave.

Senator Camacho: In order to reach out to students, you might talk to Residential Life in order to put up posters in residential halls, that way you can reach the student body without having a group of students that aren't already involved

Chair Arnone: Are there any specific action items that you hope to accomplish?

Response: We are just trying to grow the understanding of what is happening right now. If you have 3.5% of the US population that wants to make change, things start to turn around in our country and federal government. We are trying to get a larger mass of people in the organization in case we have to do mass boycotts. The more people we have, the more engaged people are at the local level, the more likely that for mass events, people will be there for us. We also hope to educate. The organization isn't the top up telling you what to do, it is figuring out what works for your community. We want people to be seen, writing postcards about elections, partnering with other organizations. There are so many different directions, and we are open to all of your ideas.

Vice Provost Amer Ahmed, James Ross, and Erika Lala Presenting on the Intercultural Centers

- James Ross, director of the Intercultural and Interfaith Center
- Erika Lala: I came to this body at the end of the last academic year to talk about the climate survey
 - o Intergroup dialogue: pedagogical model of talking across groups
- Within the division, the things that are most visible are the Intercultural Centers

- o Interfaith: We promote religious pluralism and ensure that UVM is a place where everyone can practice, experience, or learn about religions of their choice
 - Creating literal and figurative (religious accommodation, especially around holidays and observances) space for people
 - Try to engage conversations about religion
- Mosaic Intercultural Center: student lounge, food pantry, kitchen, drop-in counseling, Friday Breakfast, community dinner, welcome back barbecue, graduation brunch, work with affiliated clubs recognized by SGA
- Prism Intercultural Center includes WAGE and Prism. It focuses on campus equity, engagement, and the men and masculinity programs.
- Centers and programs exist to advance student success across the reality of their experience here at UVM
- Men and masculinity: doing work that is now held within a single program led by a program director, working on new important projects, creating an advisory committee for Prism, the first meeting of that will be happening within the month
