SUMMARY OF PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES- OVERALL

I am a gynecologic oncologist with a passion for medical education that empowers future and current clinicians to build a culture of educational excellence that promotes quality patient care.

As a respected gynecologic oncologist consultant for region, I provide high quality, evidence-based, patient-centered care that includes the full spectrum of cancer care including chemotherapy, surgery, and end-of-life care. Since 2016, I have been awarded the UVMHC Healthcare Hero Award 10 times due to patient financial donations to UVMHC in recognition of my clinical care.

In March of 2020, I ascended to my current role as Level Director of the Clinical Clerkships at LCOM. I assumed this leadership position amid a global pandemic and just one month prior to LCOM pivoting to remote learning and the suspension of clinical activities. With a group of 124 eager medical students, excited to begin their clinical clerkship curriculum, as Chair of the Clerkship Subcommittee of the Medical Curriculum Committee, I inspired the Clerkship Directors to be innovative in non-clinical clerkship education delivery, developing the Cognitive Clerkship Curriculum, which allowed medical students to remain enrolled and engaged in their medical education during the Stay Home Stay Safe mandate. I worked closely with the Director of Simulation to develop a 2 week remote Telehealth course for clerkship students. Furthermore, I worked with our clinical affiliate sites to determine when and how to return LCOM students back to the clinical environment safely and within new guidelines that impacted learner capacity, space issues and access to PPE.

In addition 2020/2021 was our LCME self-study year led my team in reviewing, revising and addressing LCME elements related to the Clerkship curriculum. I was able to command the attention of the faculty and staff to ensure on-time completion of time sensitive tasks, which resulted in higher quality content and well-prepared faculty participants in our LCME site visit.

I have a change leadership style, with the ability to adapt to periods of growth, disruption or uncertainty, empower faculty to engage, and inspire action. My leadership locally and nationally is grounded in the application of practice, response to challenges, and creative initiatives to build a culture of educational excellence. As an active member of the LCOM Teaching Academy (TA) and a member of the Undergraduate Medical Education Committee (UMEC) for the Association of Professors of Gynecology and Obstetrics (APGO), I have developed and participated in many faculty development programs to improve the quality of medical education and promote an academic environment that fosters the value and the impact of educators locally, regionally and nationally. Specifically, I developed a Clinicians as Teachers 101 Faculty Development Series, which is a 3-part faculty development series for academic and community clinical educators in our region (UVM and Nuvance clinical campuses) that launched via zoom in September 2020, now entering its third year. Due to its success, I will be leading a similar, national curriculum for the Alliance for Clinical Education (ACE) which started in September of 2021 and is now entering its second year.

SUMMARY OF TEACHING ACTIVITIES
