Director's Note

The students of UVM's theater program won't stop talking about María Irene Fornés. Their hunger for her work reminds me of my own discovery of her—something of an unclouding, like meeting an old friend. The students are the ones who chose this piece. Every time I passed by a group in the theater lobby, they would call to me, asking-"Leila, can we please do Fefu?" I started thinking, yes. Of course. Why wouldn't we do Fefu?

There is a magic to this text. When engaging in Fornés' work, it is impossible not to feel the playwright's presence energizing the creative space. As a teacher, poet, and truthful world builder, Maria Irene Fornés touches all of our theatrical journeys, whether you're aware of her or not. She comes to us as a brilliant specter who forces us to fall in love with the odd, raw, humiliating and humorous parts of life- all while laughing in the face of our creative expectations. *Fefu and Her Friends* is a clear example of her magic working. It sneaks up on you. A simple play, but as you dig deeper and deeper into the world of these women, you are somehow left gutted. More questions than answers.

Audiences like to think of this as a feminist piece because they don't know what else to point to. It is, after all, about women and their relationships to one another. But it is larger than gender. Fornés says that her intention in writing *Fefu and Her Friends* was "not necessarily to promote kindness to the opposite sex but something ultimately more interesting, which is that any human being is a member of our species and if we do not allow our imagination to receive the experiences of others because they are of a different gender, we will shrivel and decay, and our spirit will become a dry prune and we will become ill and die and we will not go to heaven because in heaven they do not allow dry prunes." Enough said.

The play uncovers the pieces of us all, regardless of gender, that must grapple with identity and self-loathing. Theater is most powerful when it causes a stir internally and externally. Politically and personally. Artistically and textually. Fefu (and her friends) are teasing out their feelings in order to honor ours. The characters stir something in us, forcing us to speak to those judges and guardians in

our own lives. Fornés was interested in the experience of truth. The reason I believe Fefu resonates with audiences so acutely is because it's simply truth- both gendered and human, imperfect and whole. In a world obsessed with truths, we tend to focus on facts. But beyond facts, there is the absurd truth of being alive and all the revolting, beautiful ways that manifests.

I'd like to thank my brilliant cast and crew for their endless curiosity and hard work. I hope you see the passion and care they all put into this piece.
