## Post-Doctoral Associate

# DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & APPLIED ECONOMICS

**JOB SUMMARY:** We seek a Post-doctoral Associate to join the Ecological Economics node of the Leadership for the Ecozoic (L4E) initiative at The University of Vermont. **We are specifically looking for an individual to research inflation, its drivers, and its political impacts.** The position is for 2 years, ideally beginning September 1, 2026. The workload of this position will be approximately 80% research and up to 20% student engagement and/or course design and teaching (if interested).

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Research: We have a very poor understanding of inflation. Our measures are limited, our drivers are empirically weak, and our solutions are blunt and inefficacious. This is due to the market-centrality of the hegemonic approach to inflation. This project seeks to explore inflation as a liberal phenomenon by drawing upon a broad heterodox social science literature including ecological economics, ecofeminism, sociology, political economy, and degrowth. We also seek to explore the political dynamics of inflation through a post-liberal lens that aims to re-embed value through rejecting the liberal separation between economy, community, and ecology.

The project has three major inquiries that overlap.

- 1) Build a political economic theory of inflation as a distributional and political process, power relation, and ecological dynamic.
  - a. What is inflation and how is it measured?
  - b. What causes inflation?
  - c. What reduces or mediates the impacts of inflation?
  - d. What does inflation cause?
    \*While this project is largely conceptual, it will include descriptive statistics (time series, scatterplots, etc) to critique mainstream drivers (money supply, debt, and inflation) and develop robust political economic drivers (power, labor dynamics, monetary lifecycle dynamics) of inflation.

#### 2) Test evidence of mainstream and new theory.

- a. Test mainstream drivers of and solutions to inflation, including debt, money supply, velocity, labor share, and other mainstream macro inflation drivers.
- b. Test alternate drivers of inflation, including income inequality, financialization, bond yields, resource constraints, ecological/biodiversity health, corporate profit, market control, quality of lending, income and monetary distribution and growth, tax structure, beneficiaries of inflation, political dynamics, commodification of commons, loss of social safety net, and others.

### 3) A Green, Postliberal State

- a. Develop a framing of the State in the context of inflation as a liberal phenomenon.
- b. How might a 'commons' approach to basic services eliminate or mediate inflationary pressures?
- c. How might non-capitalist industrial policy, democratization of credit, and value creation that is aligned with ecological limits influence inflation or its effects?
- d. Could an alternative understanding of inflation give rise to a progressive green politics rather than authoritarian illiberalism or institutionalized neoliberalism?

#### Advising/Mentorship/Teaching

- Organize, manage, and contribute to lab meetings, webinars, workshops, and presentations
- Mentor L4E-affiliated students to develop their research and apply for external research funding
- Work to create and ensure an inclusive environment for students, researchers, and collaborators

**QUALIFICATIONS:** A Ph.D. is required for this position. The ideal candidate will have education and/or experience related to ecological economics, complex systems, degrowth, political ecology, or related fields.. The ideal candidate is interested in the project, very self-directed and able to take this project and run with it.

**SALARY:** \$57,000 in the first year plus benefits, including three weeks of vacation.
