Spend your summer conducting research at Mass General Brigham through the Center for Academic Development and Enrichment's Office for Engagement and Enrichment.

The Four Directions Summer Research Program was founded by Native American students at Harvard Medical School who shared a common vision: expanding educational and career opportunities for promising Native American and Indigenous students.

Our mission is to train the next generation of leaders in Native American and Indigenous health. With support from Mass General Brigham and guidance from dedicated faculty mentors, the program provides hands-on research experience, mentorship, and networking opportunities that prepare students for careers in medicine, research, and public health.

The program is expanding across Mass General Brigham while maintaining its original mission of training future leaders committed to improving the health of Native American and Indigenous communities.

Requirements:

- Interest in academic medicine or biomedical research.
- Undergraduate rising sophomores, juniors, and seniors; first-year medical students; graduate students; or postbaccalaureate students.
- U.S. citizen or permanent resident.
- Completed application with personal statement, resume/CV, photo, two letters of recommendation, and all required transcripts.
- Ability to work exclusively at Mass General Brigham for 8 weeks with full availability for the entire duration.
