



Lyric Theater - Frozen - 4/11/26 - 6pm



Main District Energy Plant Tour - 1/13/26

Join the Staff Council Community Engagement Committee for an exclusive tour of the University's Main District Energy Plant (MDEP) and the STEM building's mechanical penthouse. At the MDEP, you'll explore a highly efficient central facility where massive boilers, chillers, and heat-exchange systems generate and distribute thermal energy to multiple buildings through an underground pipe network. You'll also visit the control room, featuring real-time monitoring screens that showcase the scale of campus-wide heating and cooling.

Next, the tour continues to the STEM mechanical penthouse. Here, you'll see air-handling units, pumps, and ventilation systems that deliver fresh air, heating, and cooling throughout the building. While learning how these systems work, you'll also enjoy unique views of the surrounding area.






Catamount Safety Award Nominations
