Concord Woods, a 100 acre Northern Hardwood Forest on Miles Mountain in North Concord, Vermont, begins its acquisition history with the deed of 50 acres to the University of Vermont in 1839. Another 50 acres was added shortly after. A portion of the woods was exempt from logging, but another was clear cut in 1940, as the woods were leased out. Concord Woods became a Natural Area in 1974. The woods are surrounded by land used for logging, and the documents in this collection record efforts to prevent timber trespass and reject requests to log the area. There are no trails or facilities, as the area is used primarily for research. The largest effort of this nature represented in the collection was in 1988 when the Canadian Forest Service and the U.S. The Department of Agriculture and Forest Service conducted a study on sugar maple decline. The woods have also been used for a VINS bird study since 1989.

The documents listed below are those which pertain to research undertaken in the Area. The documents are sorted by the location at which they can be accessed or found. Those housed in the Silver Special Collections, Howe Library, or otherwise are listed as such, and those held internally by the Natural Areas program are listed under the headings "Scholarworks" and "Internal Documents."
