- Complete soil sample shipping and submission documentation
- Conduct the NRCS In-Field Soil Health Assessment (IFSHA)
- Use the NRCS Pasture Condition Scoring Guide
- Interpret soil health test results and discuss findings with farmers
- Understand the requirements of the Qualified Individual (QI) role
- Follow CEMA 216 reporting procedures
