Age of Yellow birch on east side talus:

DBHs to 18" ± x 20 to 25' tall, maximum, gnarled.

Dead branches:

- Trees #
11 3½" diam = 30 years
12 1" diam = 10 years
13 2" diam = 15 years
14 2½" diam = 20 years

15 3" diam = 42 years in 18" tree dead & rotting about
20' above level of trail. 252 yrs.

deadwood sample from branch of 18" DBH tree:

Same rate extrapolated to 18" DBH or more

154 yrs.
180 yrs.
135 yrs.
144 yrs.

Rate of growth as slow as 17 to 20 years per inch radius (= 2" diam).
162 yrs. → 180 yrs.

∴ Estimated age of 18" DBH trees: 135 to 252 yrs.

Other spp. on talus, which is subject to draughts & frequent movement.

Slabs 6' across have recently slid down onto trail. Many trees are bent over & righted following slides.

One 3" PB & several PB saplings
several Red Cherry

SORBS }
MM } small but common
SPRUCE }

one 12" TASP

At S end of Notch, on E side,
where there is more soil among
the boulder talus, SUGI Bt
ASH up to 18" occur, prob.
quite old. BASS just below
on sheet-washed till, no
charcoal.

There is no question that this talus slope did not burn
in the last 200+ years. NB charcoal evidence anywhere.
