Artist Rock area: Crucifer in flower. Arabis? Draba?

Sunset Rock: Cypripedium in flower bud.

George Cook, of CMtn RR (Phoenicia) reports, via phone, on 7/13/09:

Newspaper article dated Nov. 7, 1913 described Oliver H. Perry's Cable RR beginning (?) operations. Cable was $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles long [this must be double - twice the RR length.] Brought logs down from North Mtn to a sawmill on South Lake.

Here are George's findings: It ran like the Otis, with 2 cars carrying weight on each other. There must have been a passing siding mid-incline. Sawmill was 1500' ENE of Kaaterskill Station, beyond the end of sq. trackage. He found foundations [Could there be ice house foundations instead? Maybe not; sawmill was farther E] than ice house].

Look at 1980s RENFED

Kaaterskill Quad.. It shows a bldg. on top of the

2320' Knoll. George says it's a water (or sewer?) facility for North Lake Campground. The road leading ^{straight} up to it doesn't exist any more, but could have been ^{built} on the RR grade. It lines up between the sawmill & top of the cable. The cable RR then ^{must have} crossed the Pleasant Rock Shelter Trail west of Man's Glen.

The top of the cable was at 2700' level between the 2 trails just S of the Man's Glen - Escarpment Trail Jc. He found Bob Gildersleeve's GPS site for the lumber camp agreed ^{dnmos} with MK's location. See Gildersleeve pp 118, 130, 137.
