



There are several large trees between **J** & **K**, but large trees become abundant above **K**. Ash are common below **K** but become scattered above. The hemlocks are NOT in a grove at all, but scattered among N. hardwoods

Terrace averages 50 to 60 ft above the stream, but at **K** it comes down to about 30' above stream. 41" hemlock is on steep bank below terrace
