This year marks the 100th anniversary of the arrival of the Delaware & Eastern Railroad in Andes. On March 23, 1907, the long awaited connection with the outside world arrived!

Celebrate the anniversary of this event with the Andes Society for History and Culture (www.andessociety.org) by attending the opening of their commemorative exhibit "The D & E Comes to Andes" on Saturday, July 7 from 3-5 PM at the Hunting Tavern Museum. On display will be pictures and history as well as artifacts from the railroad era in Andes.

At 4:30 PM a brief tour of the old D & E Depot in Andes will be given. The building has been donated to the Town of Andes by the Wayne Decker family and is in the process of being restored by the town as a railroad museum.

The exhibit will be showing through the month of July. The Hunting Tavern Museum hours are 10-4 Saturdays through Columbus Day and by appointment. The museum is on Rt. 28 in the town of Andes.

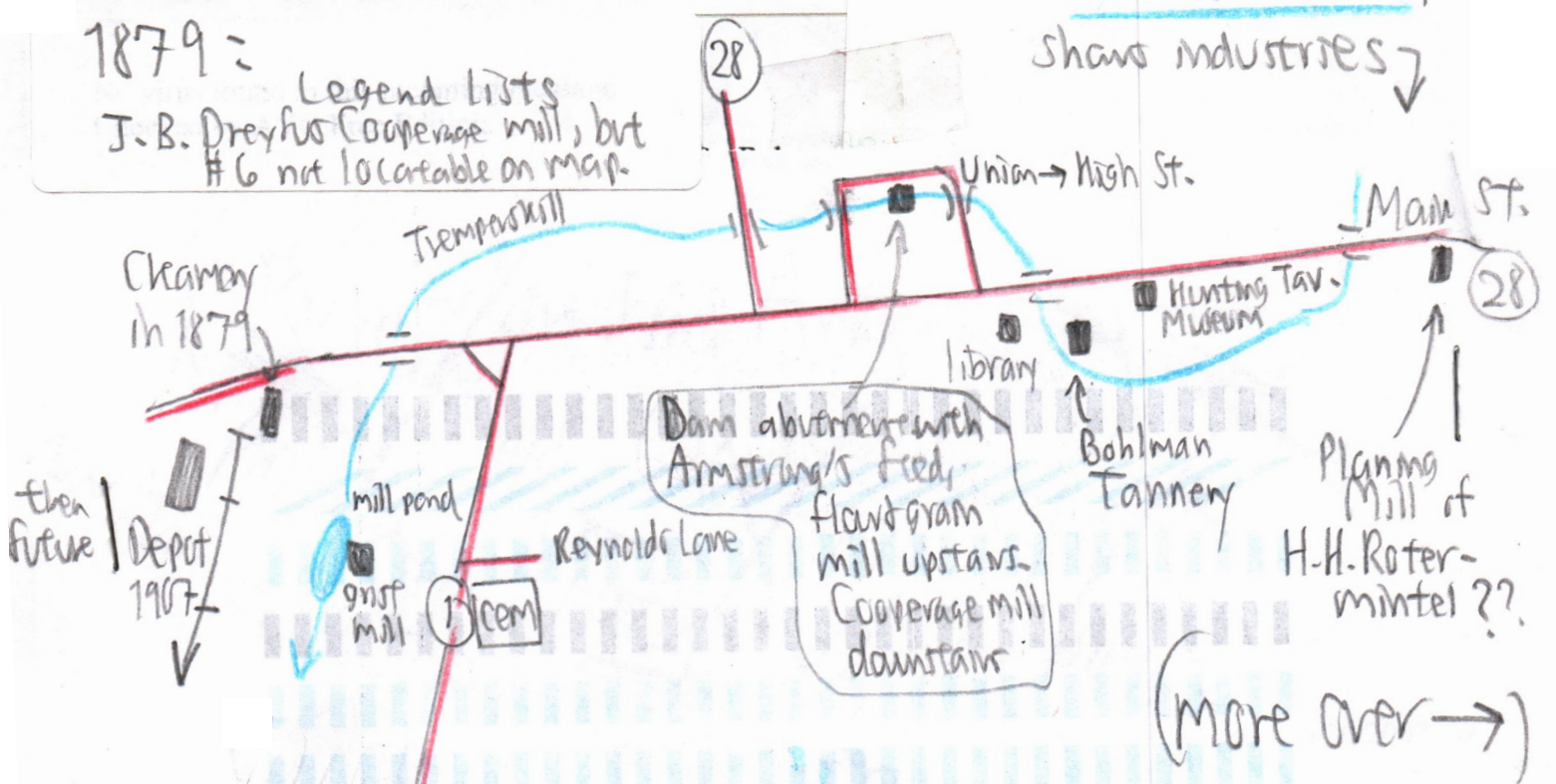
