## Thoughts about Meredith (Jurgens) Bog

All trees on 10/6/08 at SE  $\frac{2}{3}$  of bog are dead from beaver-flooding. Fir & other trees still alive at NW end  $\frac{1}{3}$ , plus a few firs in the pasture well SE of the bog.

How many sites have lost their fir over the last 12000y by beaver flooding followed by lack of ability of fir to regenerate later? — in Delaware County & elsewhere in the Cs?

Likely places for boreal remnants — Look along hwy where forests are on BOTH sides\*. In a few instances, <sup>one or</sup> both forests may never have been cleared, although cut-over. \*ie, between farms. Also look in dense hemlock stands; fir-spruce often hide in them.
