James Chickshank built the mill
Photo of Camp on Chickshank Rd on p. 5 children's.

From Thesis II p. 174
Originally located on (3) below the depot,
burned (?), + rebuilt next to the depot.

Silvester (1880) could not mention it because it wasn't built until ca. 1908

Photo of fish hatchery p. 68 of Gale & Gale (1999).

From Ed West's 1971 map, via Rick Brooks rec'd 11/20/15
On Lot 62, south 1/2, just ~~E~~^W of main tributary to Lost Cove Creek:

"ROW 12 feet wide reserved in
Deed - February 13, 1920.
Recorded - May 8, 1920
Liber 475 - Page 270
Big Indian Wood Products
to Charles Ryder"

ROW leads to Lot 37 which
was Crickshank's until 2008,
then TNC then SM 2014.

Who had the ROW? Ryder or
Big Indian Wood Products?
Who owned Lot 62 here?

From Brooks & Brooks 2005-2006 map, rec'd. 11/20/15
The above quote covered in red on Lot 62.

Patrick Miglio's map, rec'd. 12/1/15:

Nothing on the ^{big} map itself but --- plenty in Patrick's enclosures

MK p. 2 dark green line "Liber 475, cp. 270 - 12' ROW reserved to
Big Indian Wood Products (question on validity of ROW)."
The ROW parallels the main trib. on the WEST.

p. 6 James Crickshank, Inc. consubstantiated with the Big Indian
Wood Products Co. in 1920. Tyler Tract was part of James Crickshank,
1946 - Big Indian Wood Products acquires former Tyler Tracts etc
formerly part of James Crickshank Inc.

Lot 33-34 boundary is disputed.

MK thoughts: Because Crickshank owned Lots 36 & 35 in 1911, the JDftwood??
→ Logging shaman on Schmitt's 1917 map in 1911 was
prob. for their mill. Big tooth aspens are remnants following
the cut. Note trails shaman this map up Balsam mtn.
Cut was bounded on N by Platt Farm Rd & S by midcrest
of spur leading to "Tyler Hollow".
