

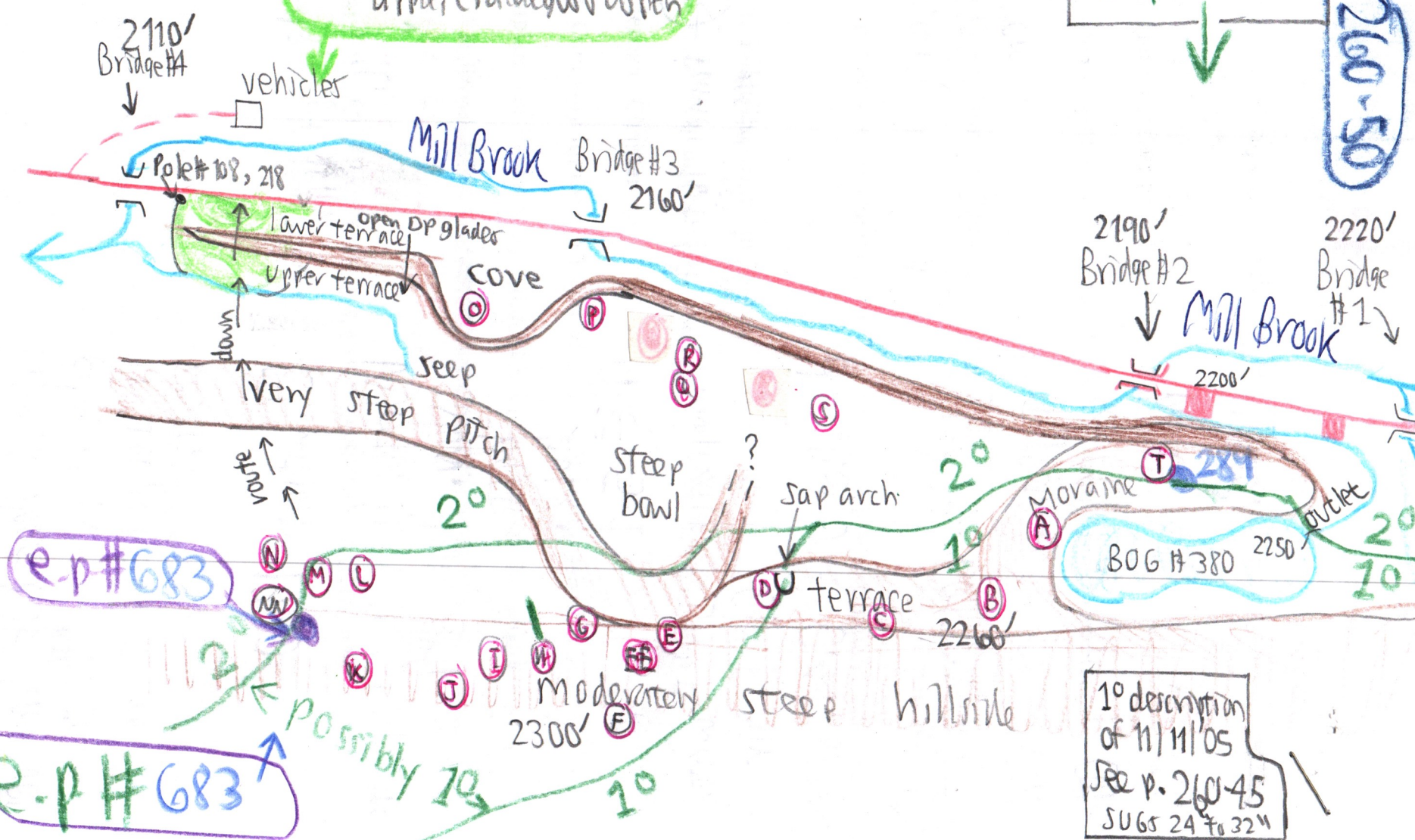


Whole E-W length of map = 0.55 mile from Bridge #1 to Bridge #4

1 CUT STUMP, >40y (COLL. WOODS)

No more big hardwoods below except 27" BC at (Q)

(Q) 2238' Two hemlocks, 28" & 29". Mill Brook audible + vehicles on road. Quite flat. 27" BC is largest hardwood. Then 27" & 30" hemlock.

2nd Stump Coll. wood i.d. Hemlock
 Hemlock grave below to NW on steeper slope, then down ^{NE} steep HEM bank to (R) 2180' where a small brook flows into the Mill Brook. Both fordable in low water.
