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The most important conclusion, I think, that is new relative to Christman's (1961?) map, is that the Acadian structure plunges south such that the ridge-forming silver-green rocks along the summit come down along the Toll Road ridge, and cross the highway near Bingham Falls, to swing across and back north to tie in with the silver-green rocks on Madonna.

The Hazens Notch Formation is much less resistant to erosion, in that it contains iron sulfides, so that soil cover tends to be thicker where it is near the surface.

The serpentine body on the ski trail north of Sterling Pond is also a new discovery, which was not exposed when Chidester and others mapped the ultramafics around the pond.
