Streamside Planting Programs for Landowners in Northwestern Vermont

Planting trees along streambanks helps reduce erosion, improve water quality, and provide habitat for fish, birds, and other wildlife. There are many organizations in northwestern Vermont who can work with landowners to plant trees alongside rivers and streams on your land at no cost to you! Reaching out to these organizations directly is the best way to determine how to get trees planted on your land. These organizations can also refer you to other programs that may be a good fit for your land and specific tree and shrub planting goals.

Natural Resources Conservation Districts (NRCDs)

- Most NRCDs have tree planting programs, which are often focused on planting 35-ft wide woody (trees and shrubs) buffers along streams. NRCDs can also connect landowners with additional local, state, or federal programs, like the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP).
