## 6. Research your top options

- Talk to people affiliated with your top major/career choices: folks in the Interest Groups, professors, staff, students in the major, and alums found on UVMConnect. Ask things like:
  - a. What fields of work do people with this major go into?
  - b. What skills/qualities etc. does it take to be successful in this major/field?
  - c. What majors are related to this one, and what differentiates this field of study?
  - d. Why did you decide to focus on this field of study?
  - e. Who else should I speak to about my interest in this major?
